Dr. James Valcour

James Valcour is an Associate Professor of Epidemiology in the Faculty of Medicine, Division of Community Health and Humanities at Memorial University of Newfoundland. He was awarded his Ph.D. in Epidemiology in 2009 from the Ontario Veterinary College at the University of Guelph. He has expertise in epidemiology, spatial statistics, infectious disease, and environmental health. His research interests include zoonotic diseases, sexually transmitted and blood-borne infections, climate change, mathematical modeling of infectious diseases, and the One Health initiative. Recent projects have involved examining the spatial distribution of *Chlamydia trachomatis* in Newfoundland and how to address spatial issues related to the geographical analysis of data that arise from rural and remote areas.
