Learning Objectives: At the end of the MAiD Advanced Training Program, participants will be able to:

- 1) Understand the historical legal and ethical debates, and what laws changed in Canada to now make MAiD a legal right for patients who qualify.
- 2) Distinguish between the rights and responsibilities of patients, physicians, and other health care professionals, and be able to provide the basic standard of care/information for patients who request MAiD, including referral if appropriate.
- 3) List eligibility criteria for MAiD.
- 4) Apply the required steps for a MAiD case, from Patient Inquiry through to Service Delivery, using protocols, policies and resources outlined by the RHAs and Dept of Health/Province, in order to navigate the process for the patient.
- 5) State the legal requirements and recommendations for physicians who participate in MAiD.
- 6) Engage with a network of professionals who can provide guidance, assessments, and support.
- 7) Understand how to document MAiD Cases according to federal/provincial requirements.
