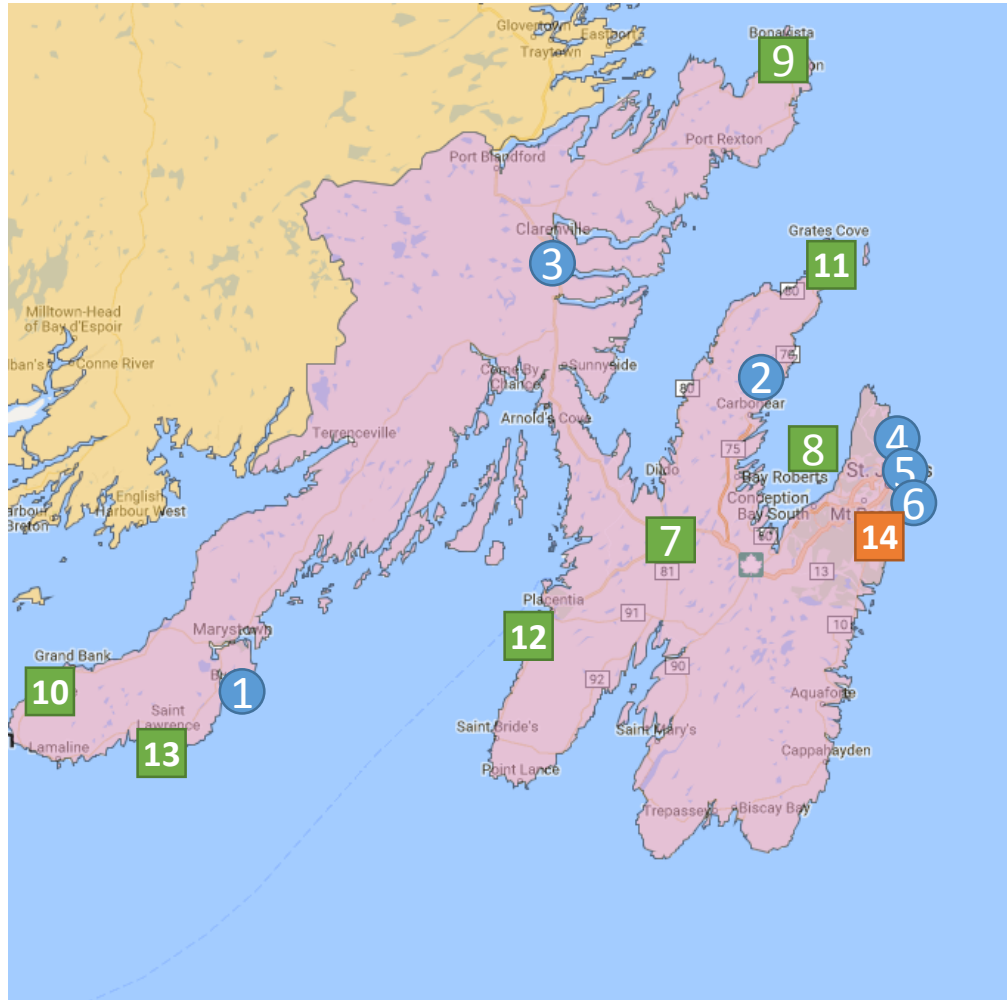

Service Distribution

Distribution of Services in Newfoundland and Labrador

- The following data has been gathered by the Newfoundland and Labrador Medical Association (NLMA) from a variety of sources including the NLMA Membership Database, the Department of Health and Community Services (HCS), Community Accounts, and the Canadian Institute for Health Information. The NLMA takes responsibility for the collation and presentation of this data. Given the nature of how the data is collected the following caveats should be considered as the information is reviewed:
 - **NLMA Membership Database** – Physician data gathered by the NLMA is self-reported. Therefore this information should be interpreted with caution as it may not be an exact reflection of approved positions or an official human resource plan.
 - **Department of Health and Community Services** – The data provided by the HCS, related to Allied Health Professionals, should also be interpreted with caution as many health care professionals travel throughout their regions to provide services to neighboring communities. For example, a Speech Language Therapist located in Gander, may travel to other communities to provide a service however, because this professional is located in Gander, the data would not capture the services provided outside of Gander.
 - **Data Omissions** – Note, the following information does not include private allied health professionals (i.e. physiotherapy, occupational therapy, etc.).
- The information to follow is not a complete account of all health services provided in NL. Rather it is a high-level snapshot of health service resources and how they could be mapped throughout the various health regions.

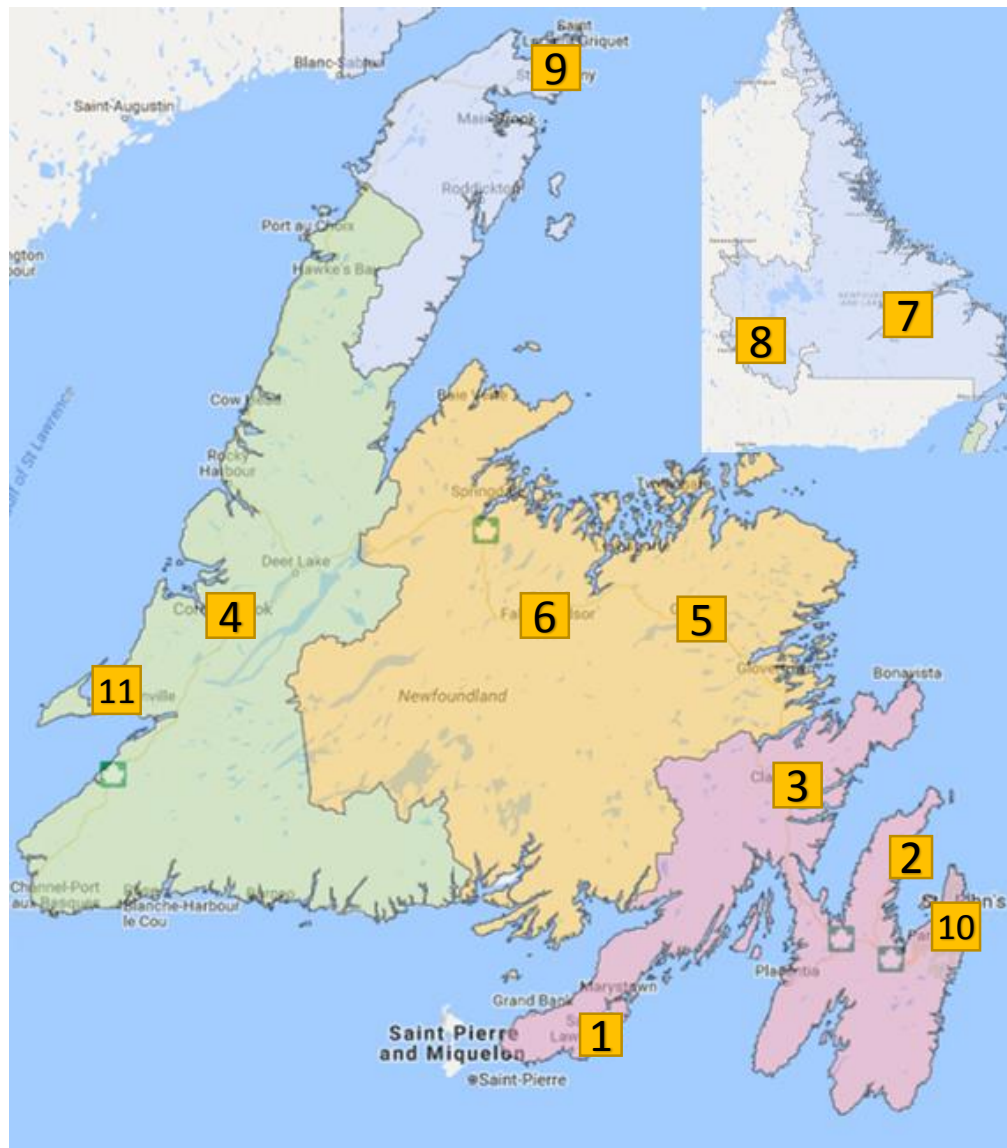
Tertiary Services (St. John's)

- The majority of specialty paediatric services (listed in the table furthest to the right) are located at the Janeway Children's Health and Rehabilitation Centre.

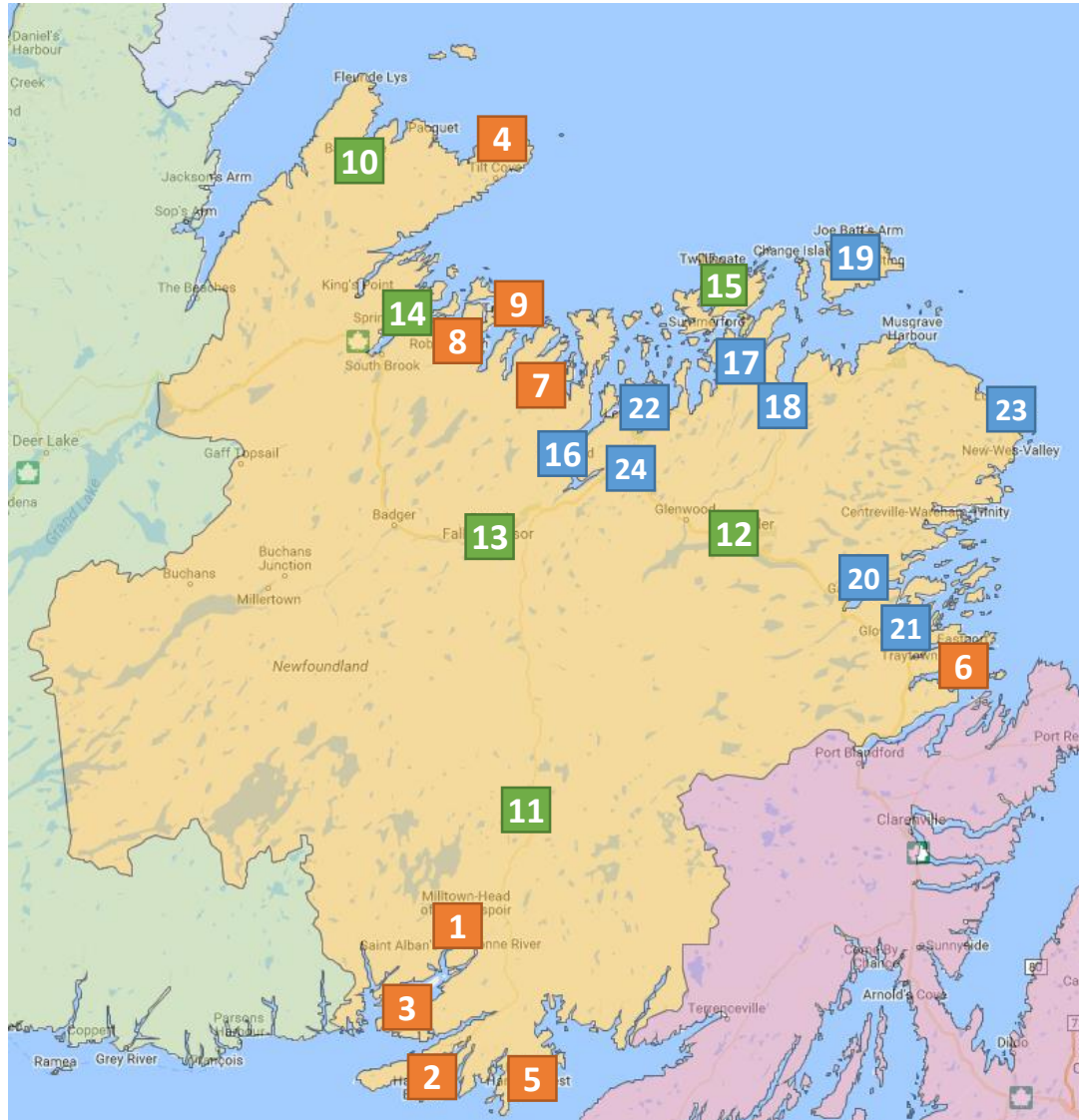

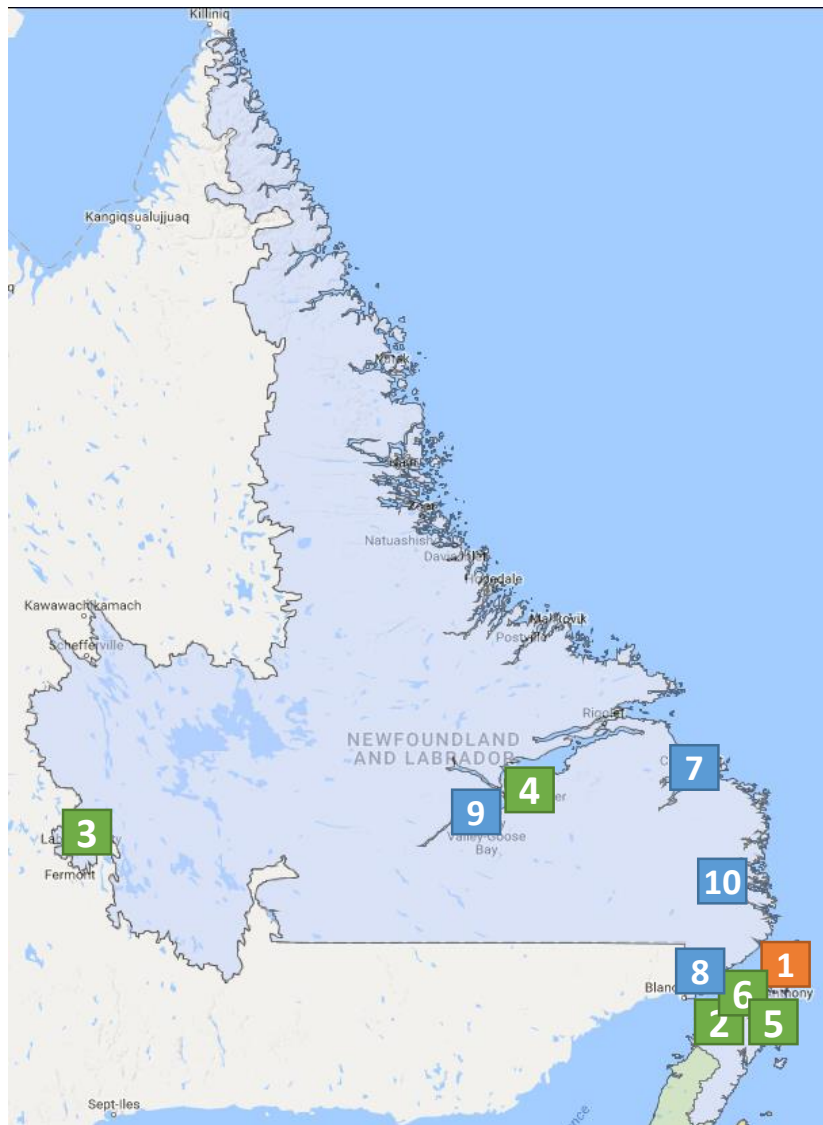

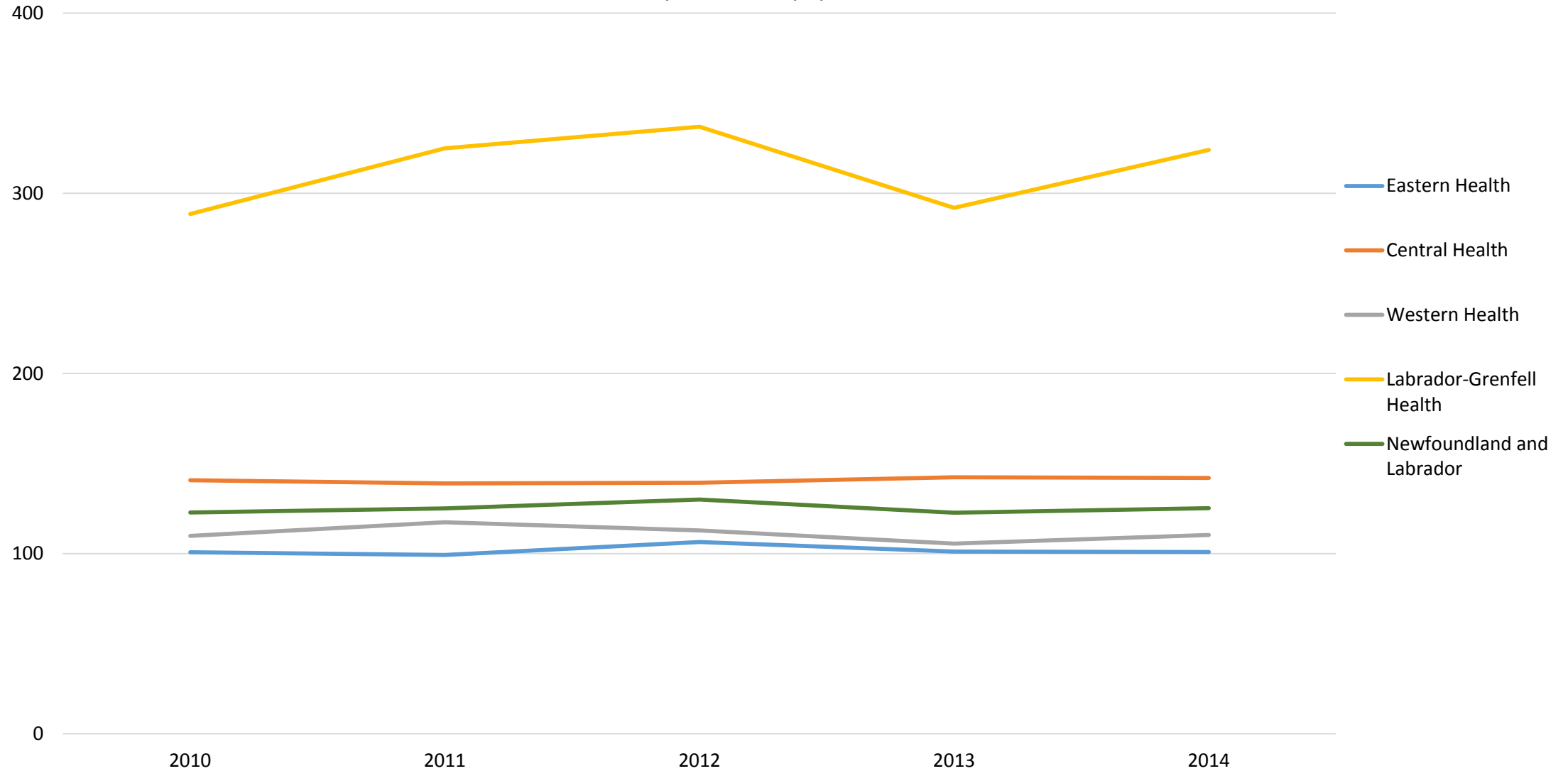

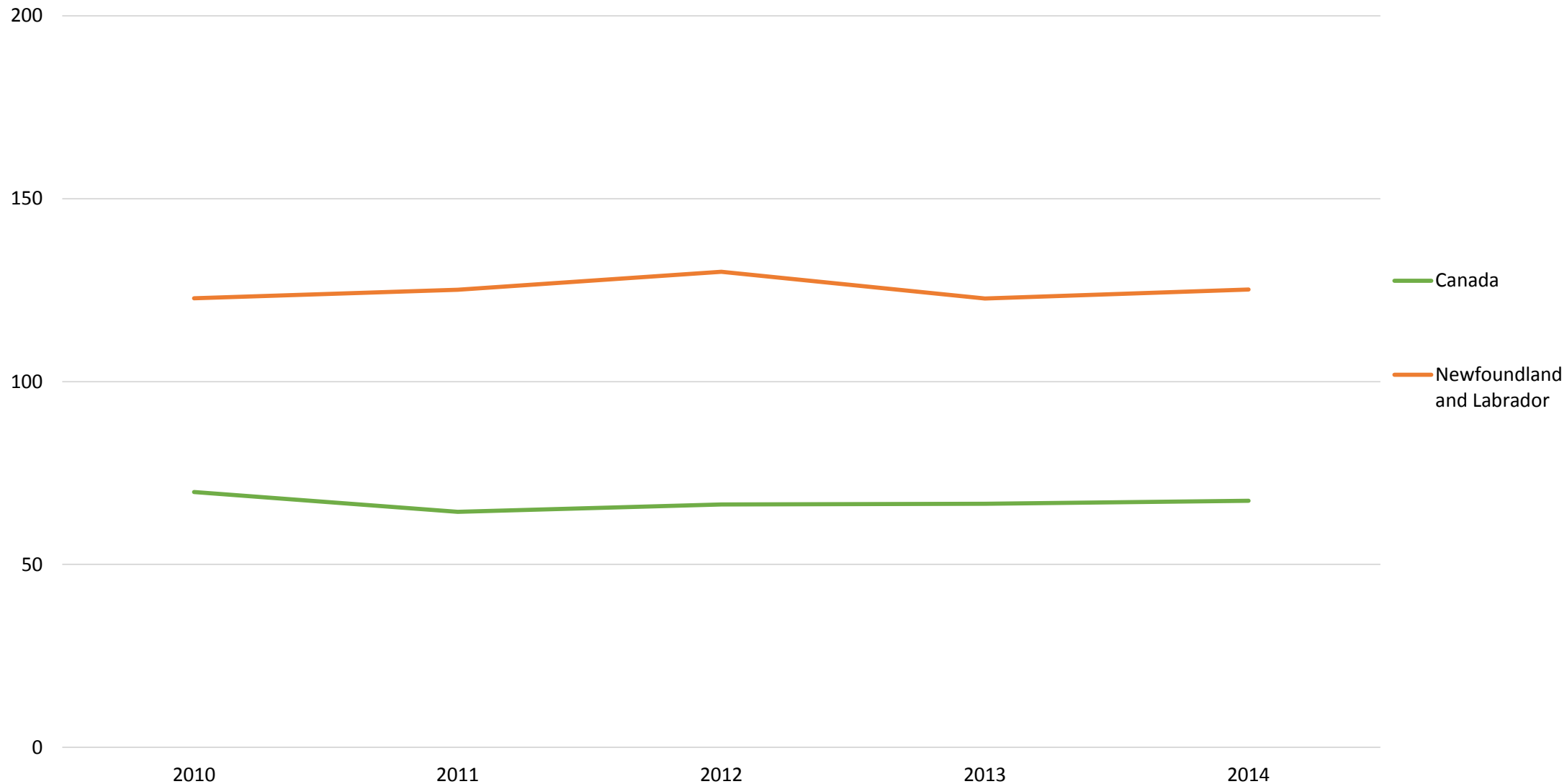
RNs/NPs Employed in a Primary Health Care Setting (NL and RHAs)

(per 100,000 population)



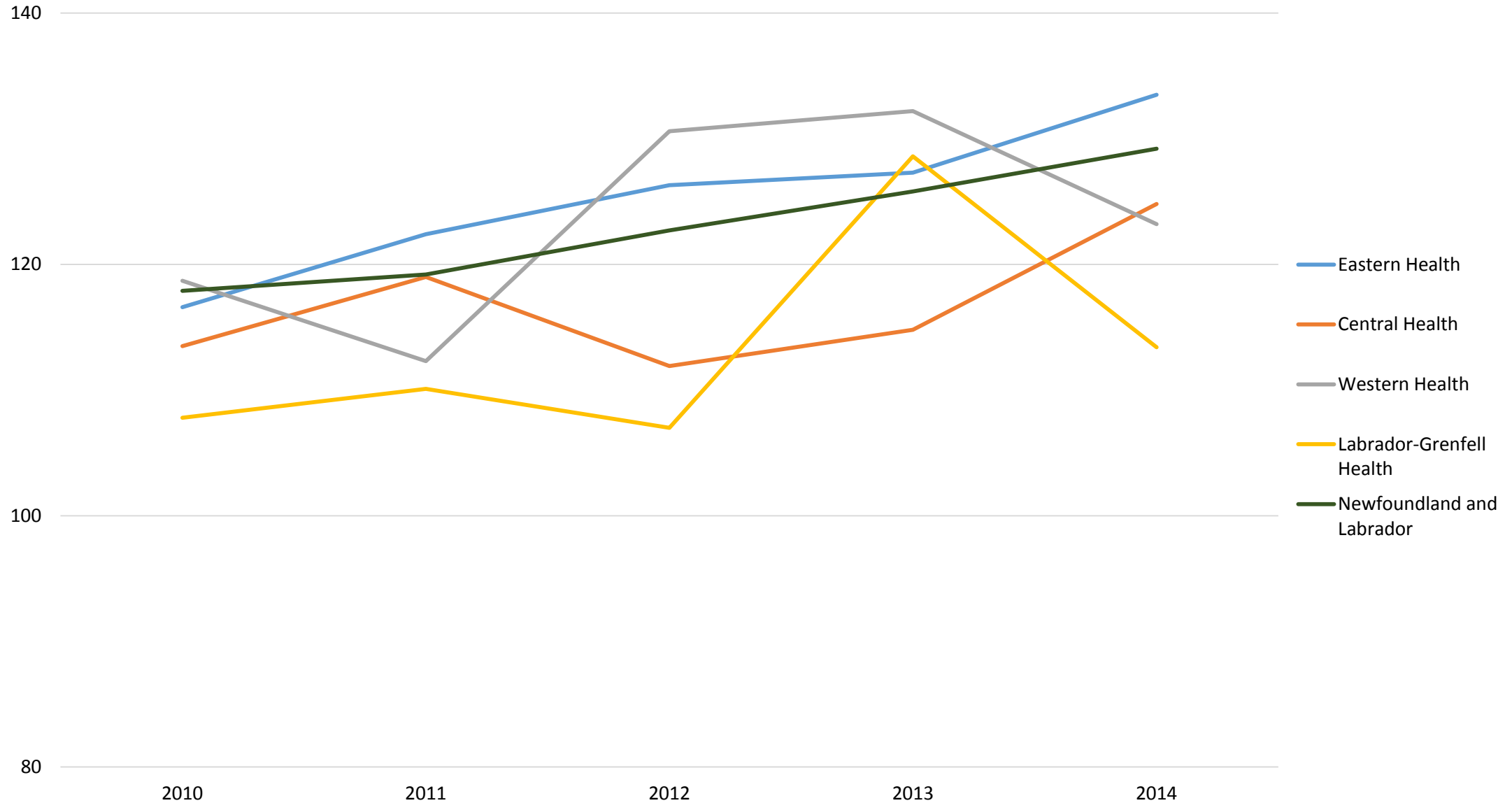
RNs/NPs Employed in a Primary Health Care Setting (NL and Canada)

per 100,000 population



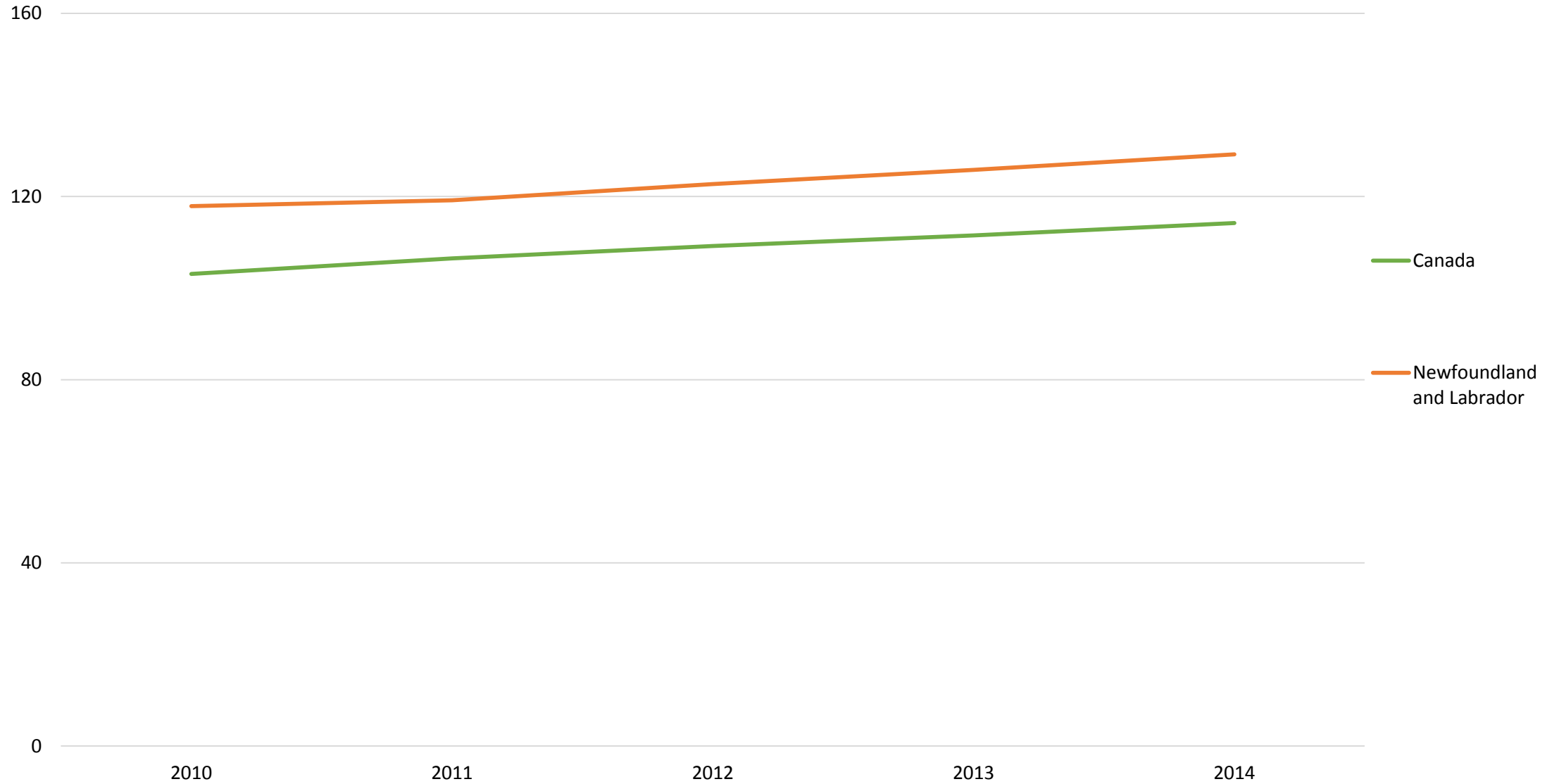

Family Physicians per 100,000 population (NL and RHAs)



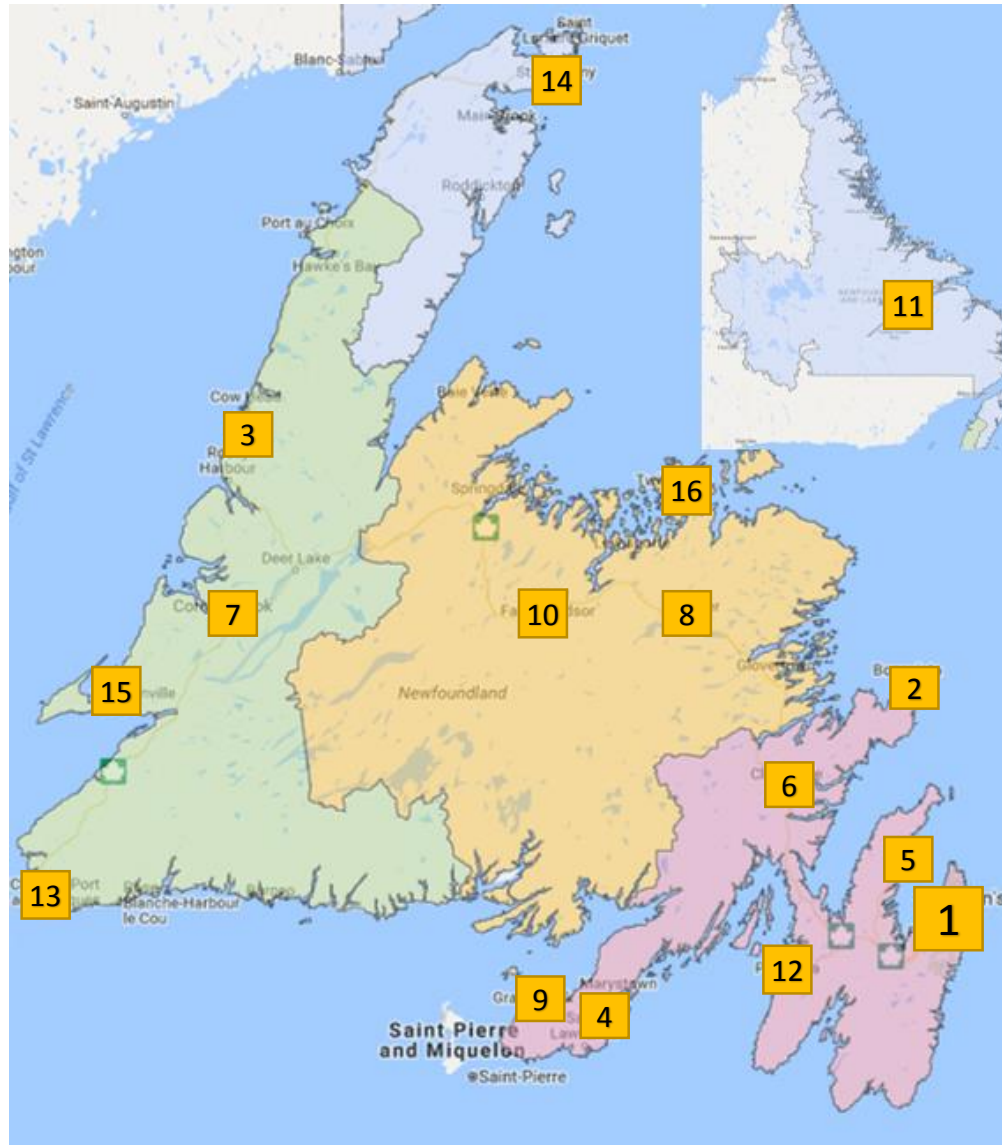

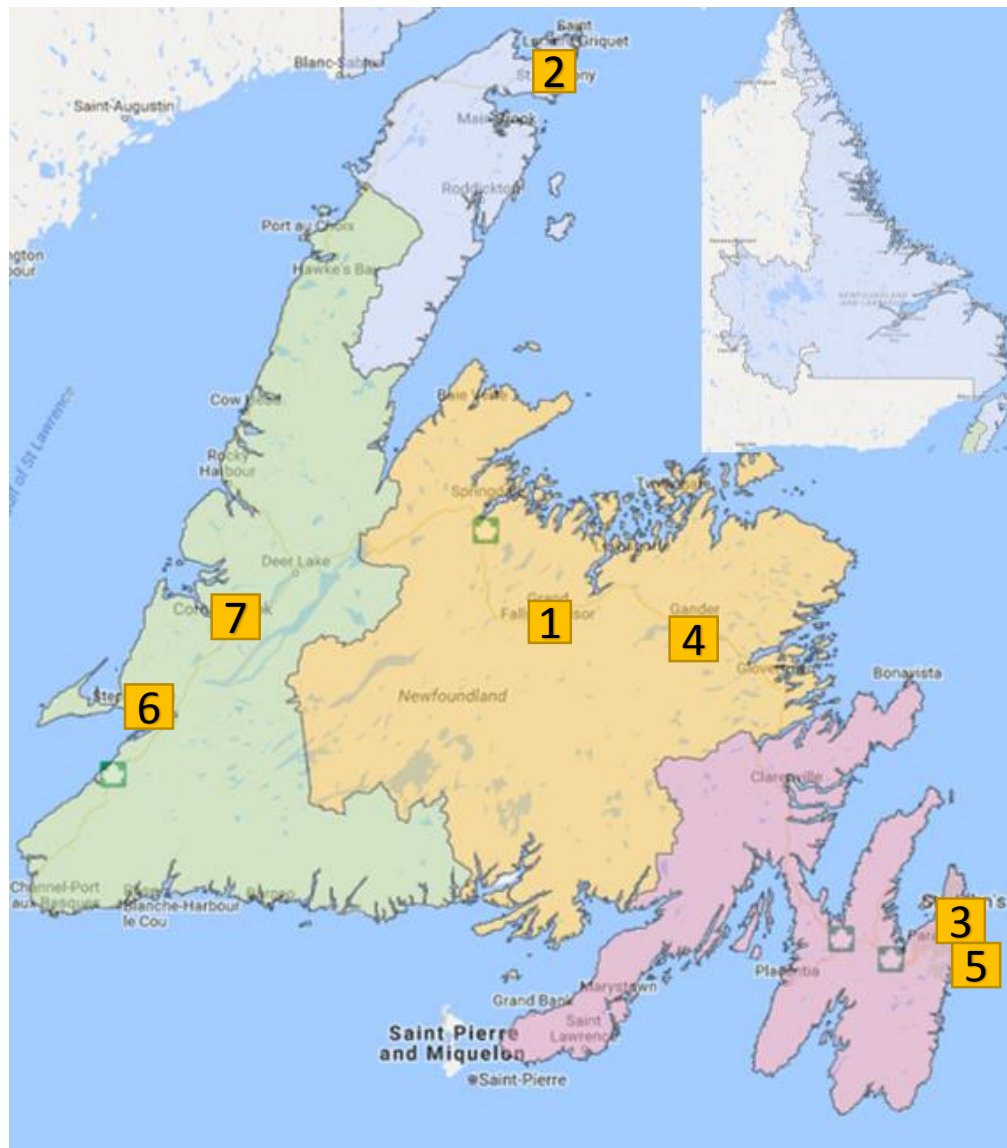

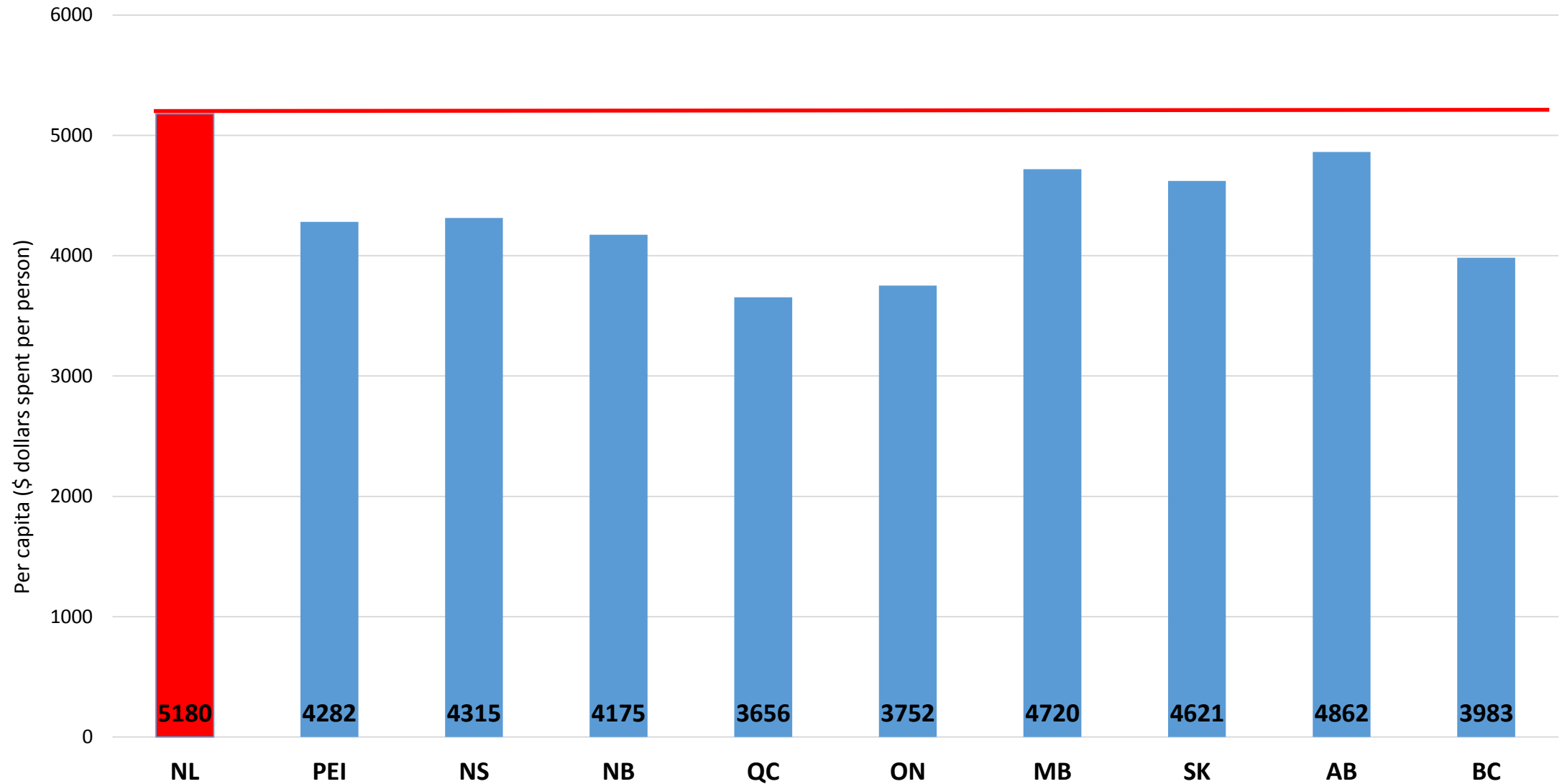

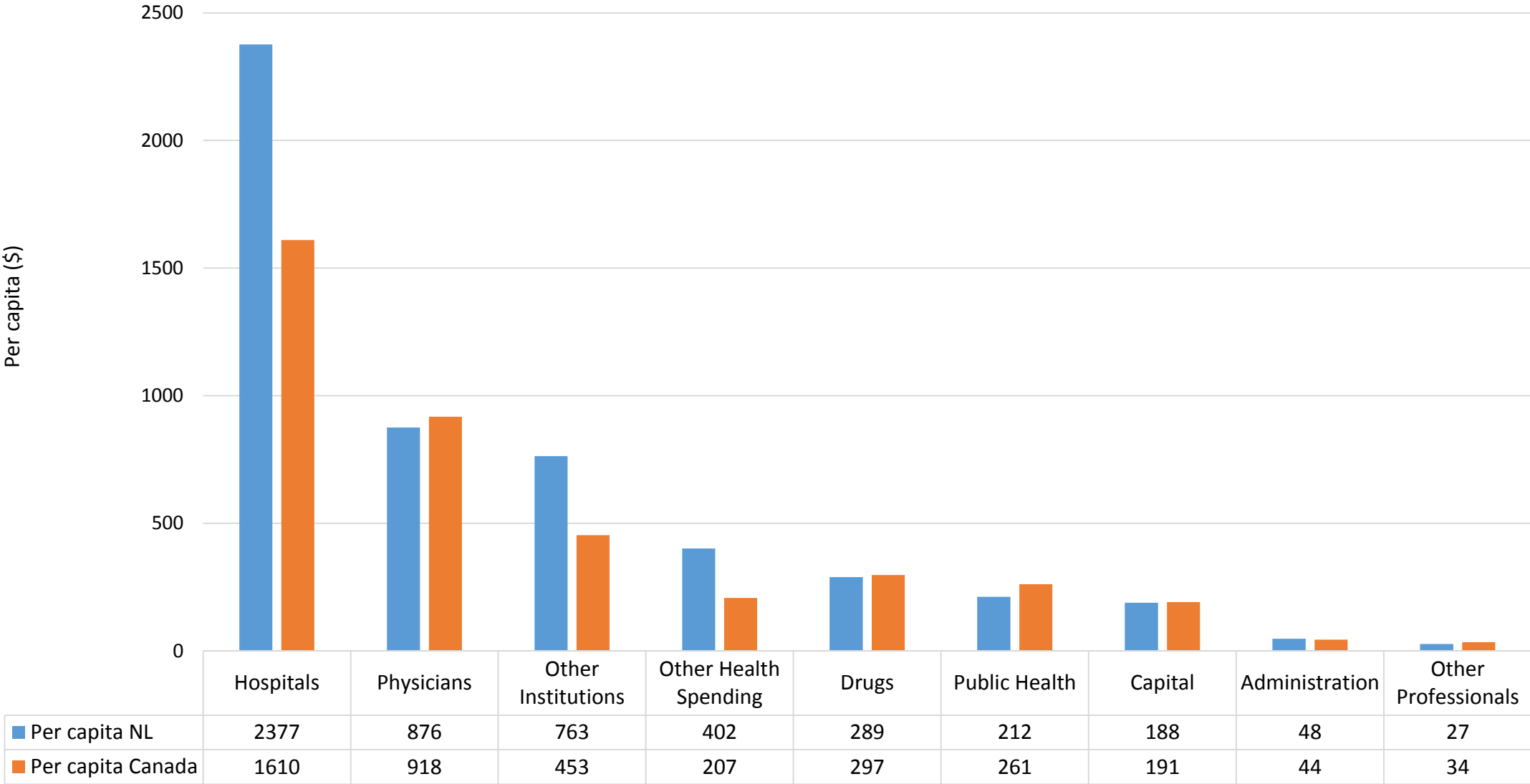

Provincial Government Health Spending, per capita, 2015



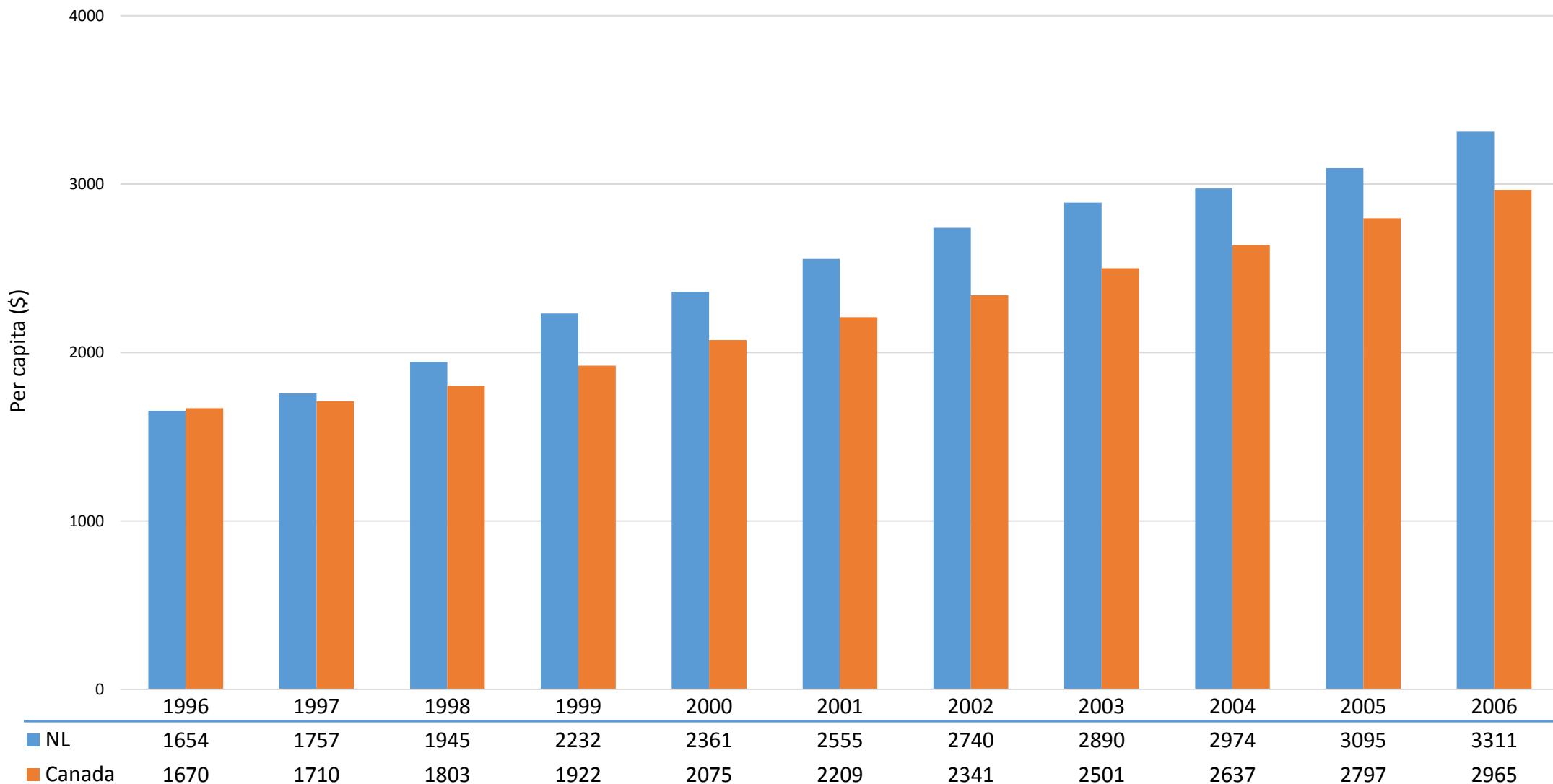

NL and Canadian Government Health Spending, by category, per capita, 2015



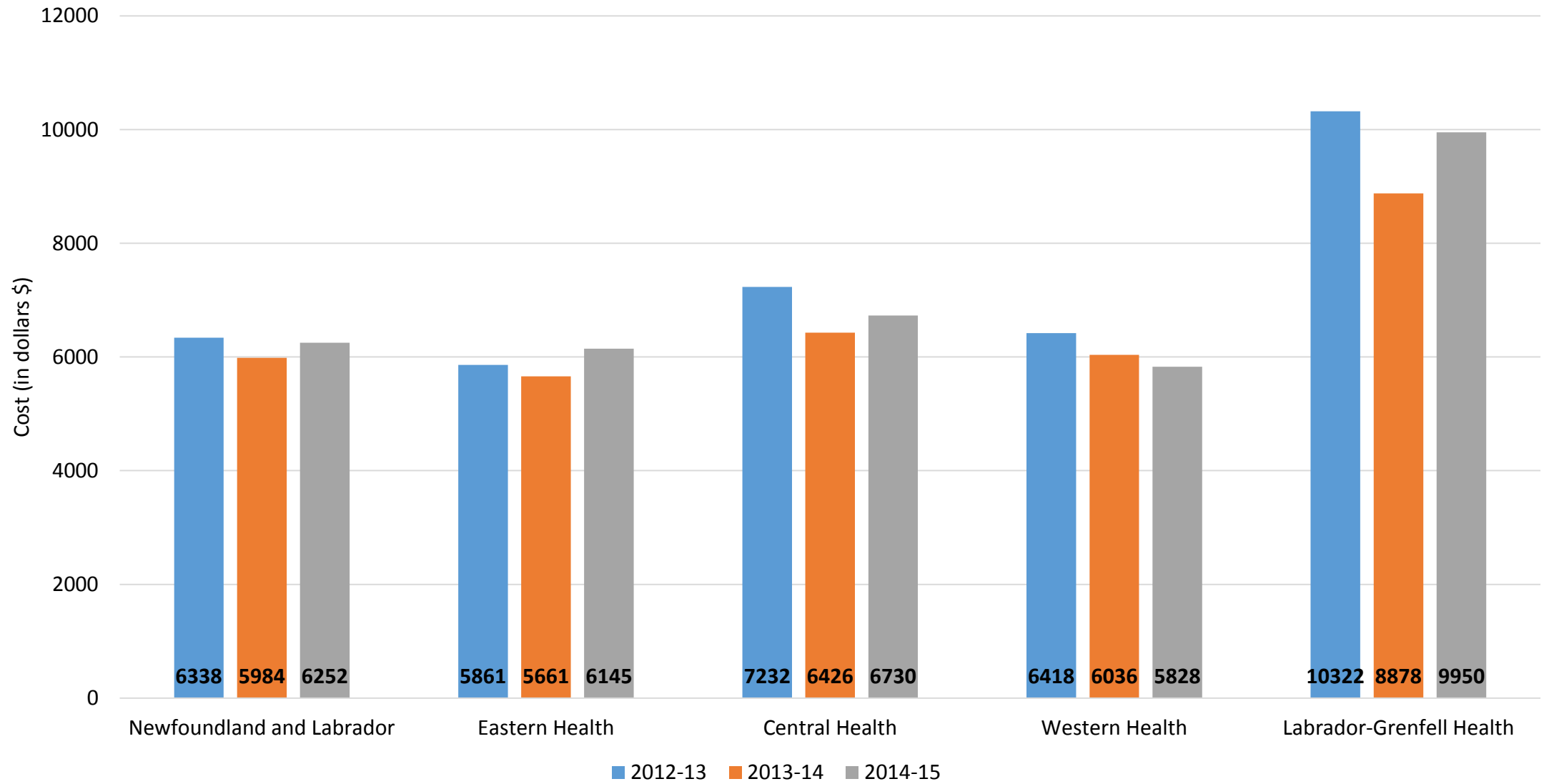

Total Government Health Spending 1996-2006, per capita, NL & Canada



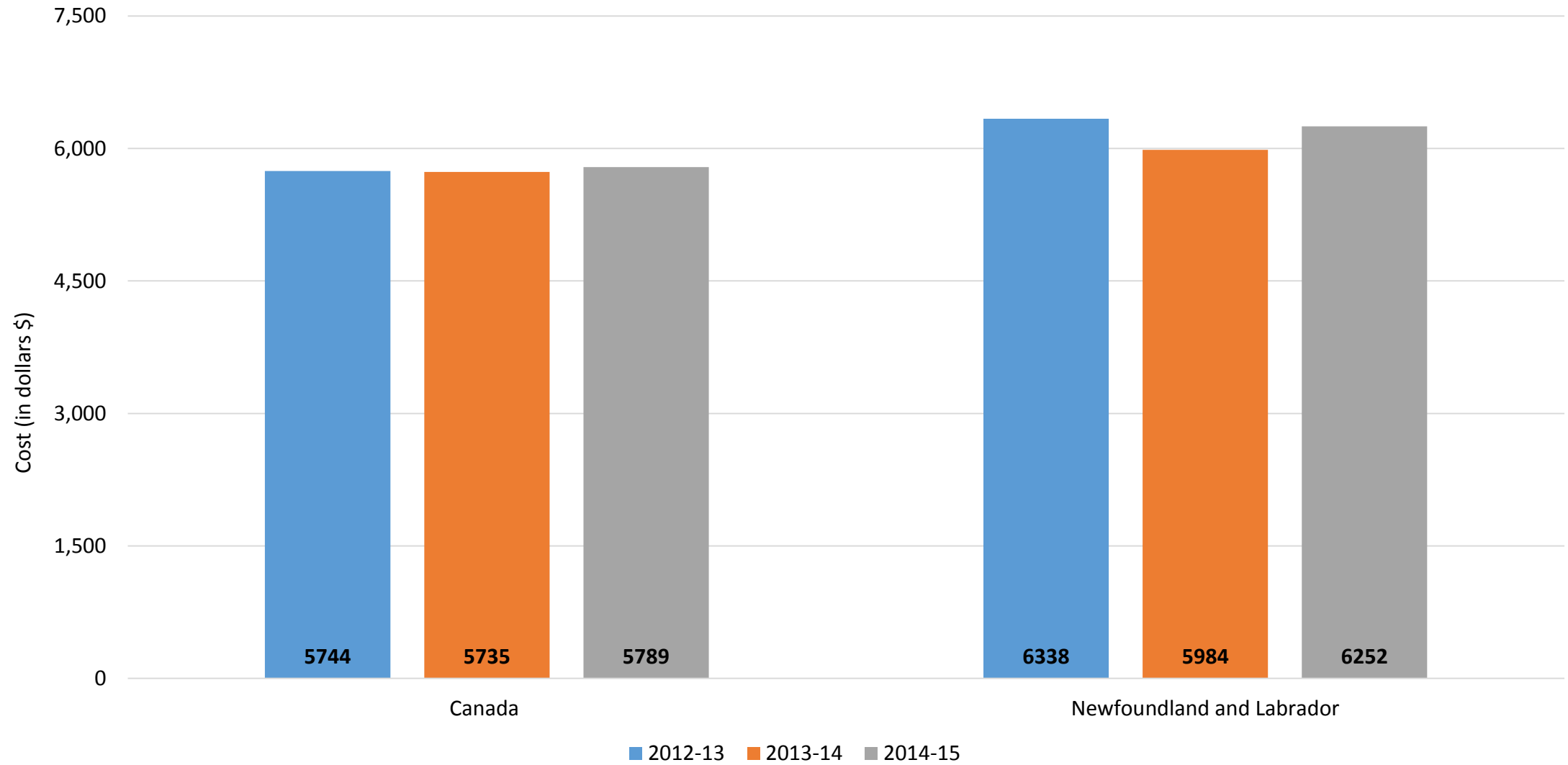

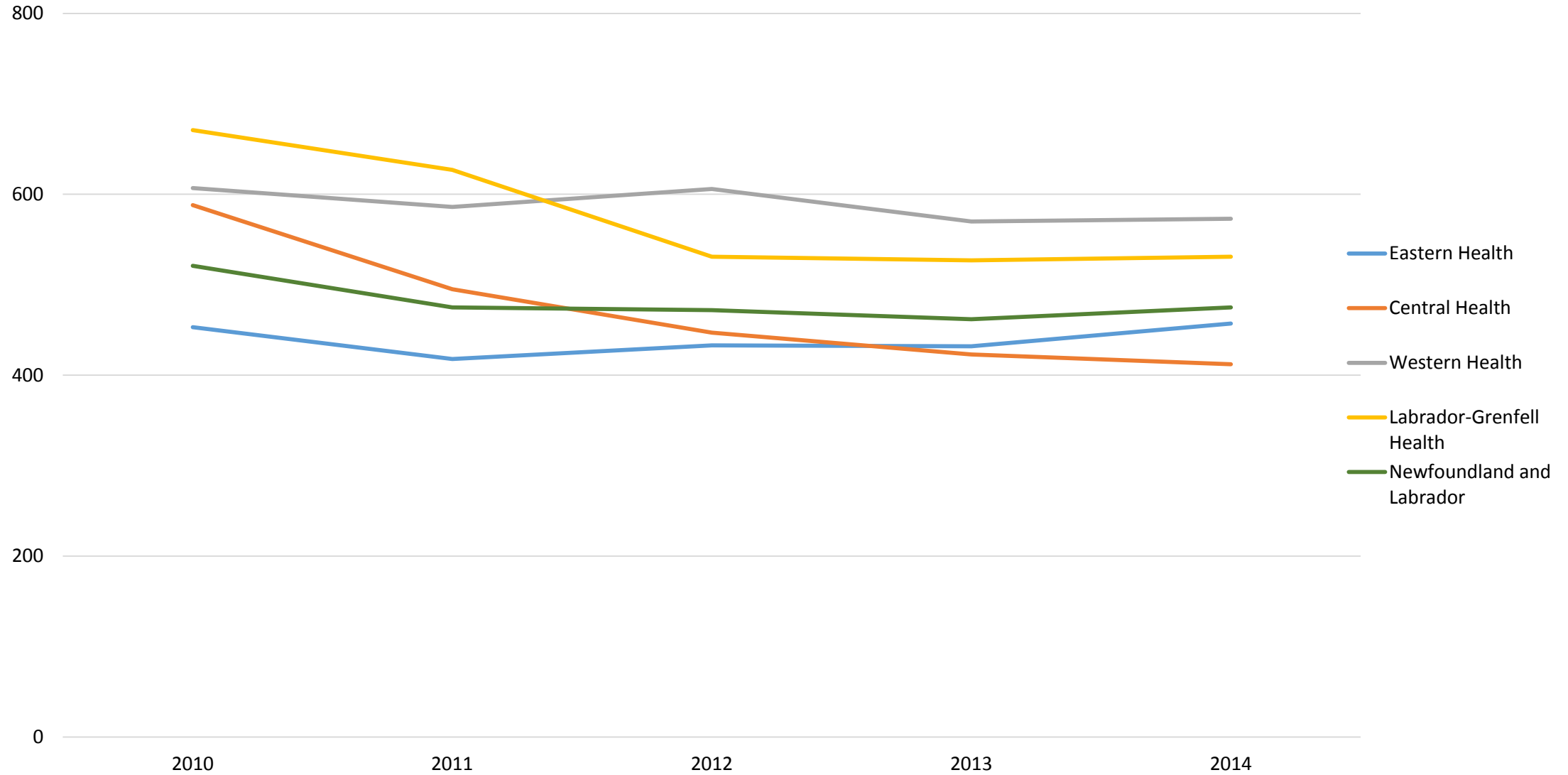

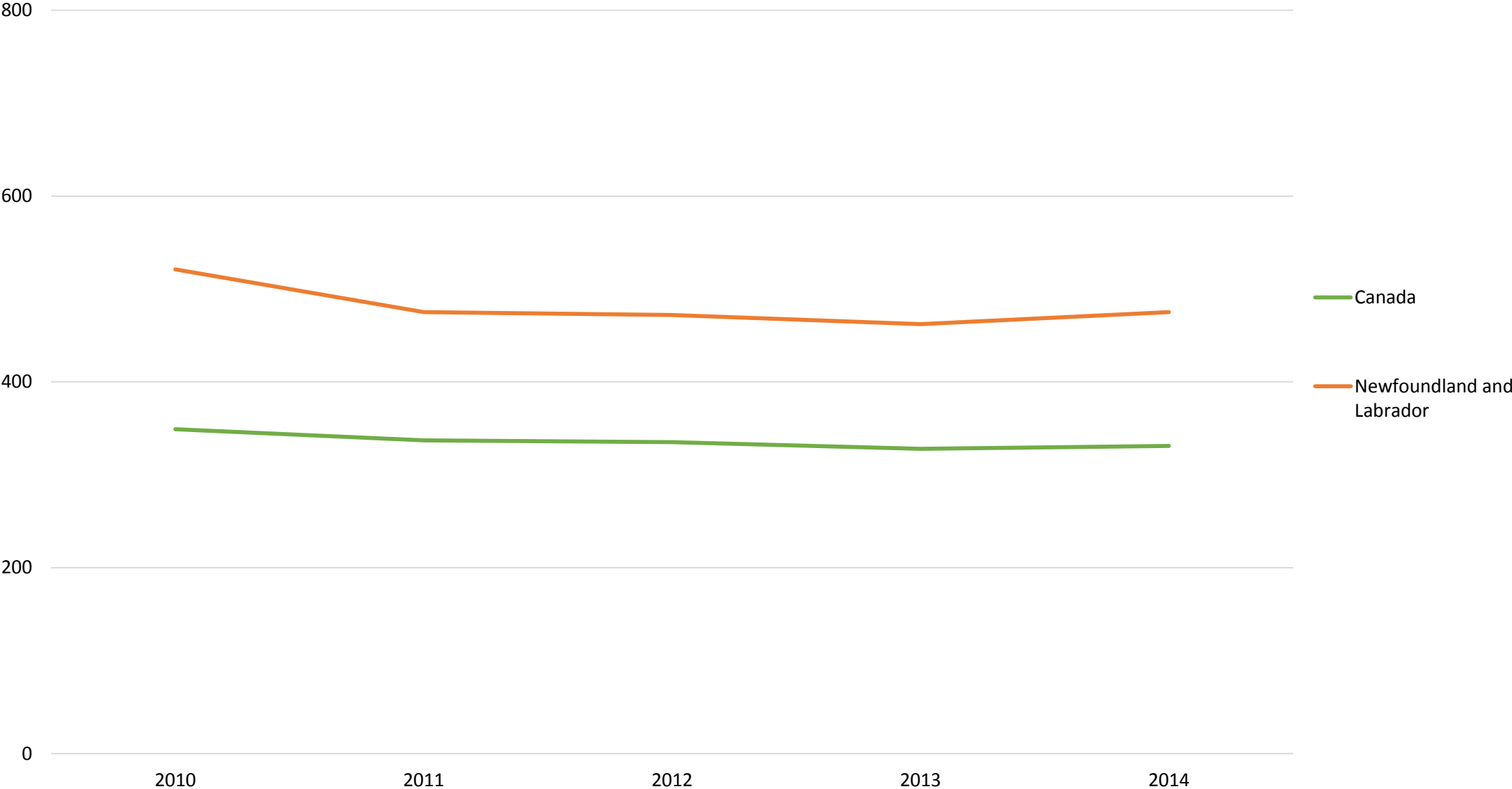

Ambulatory Care Sensitive Conditions (ACSC) Hospitalization Rate per 100,000 (NL and RHAs)



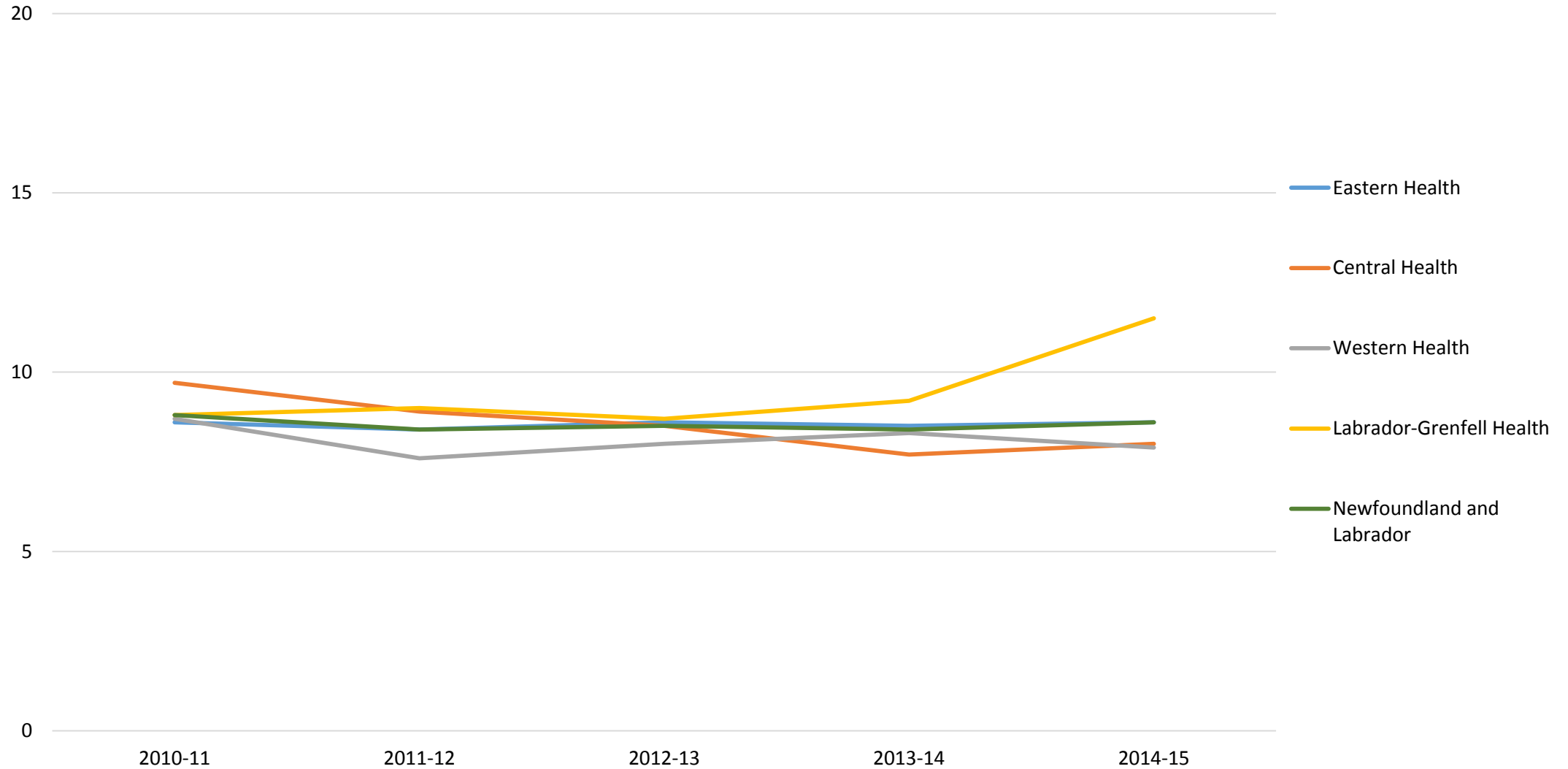
ACSC Hospitalization Rate per 100,000 (NL and Canada)

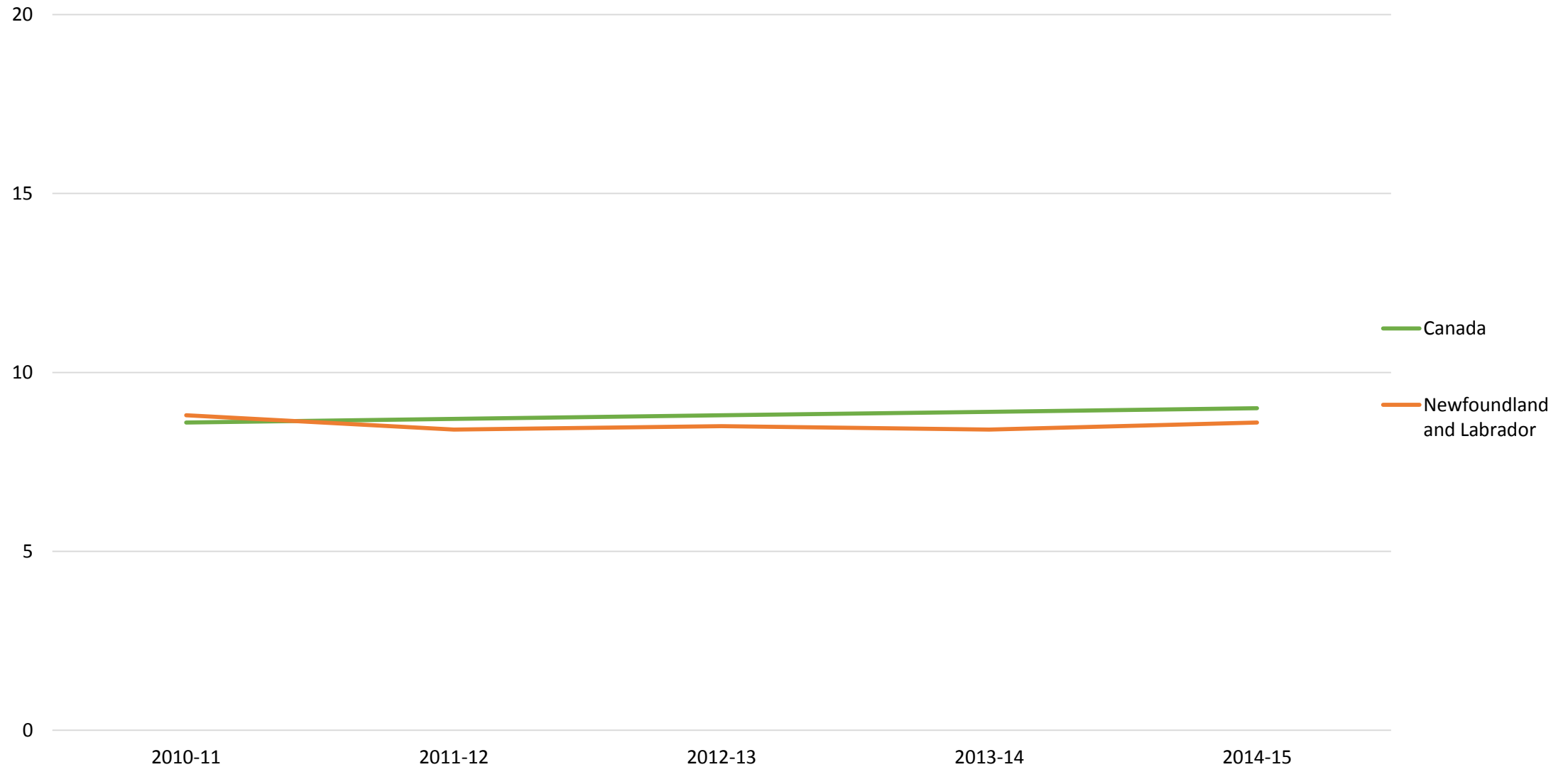
Readmissions – All Patients (NL and RHAs)

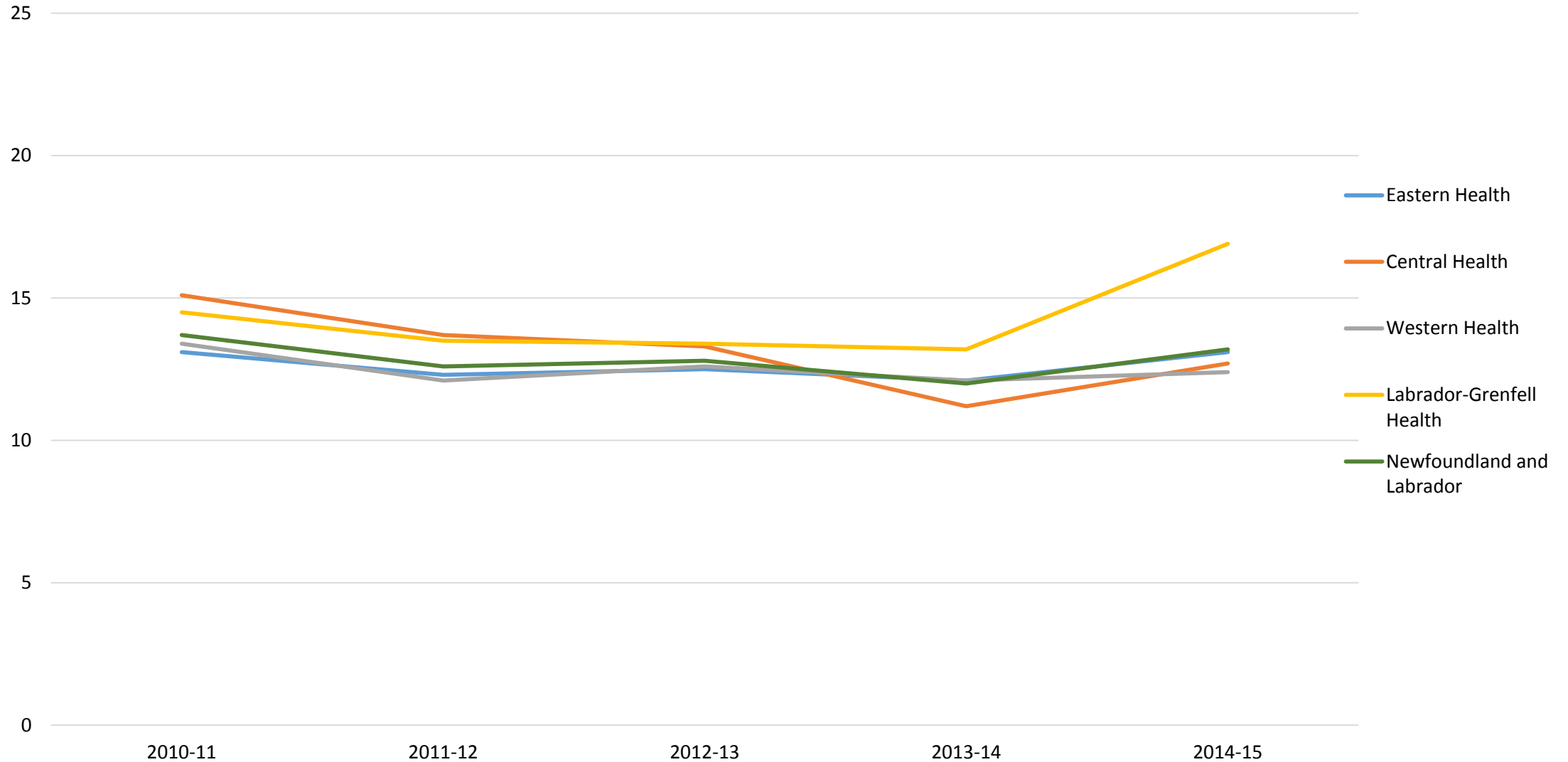
Percent Readmitted to Hospital within 30 Days of Discharge

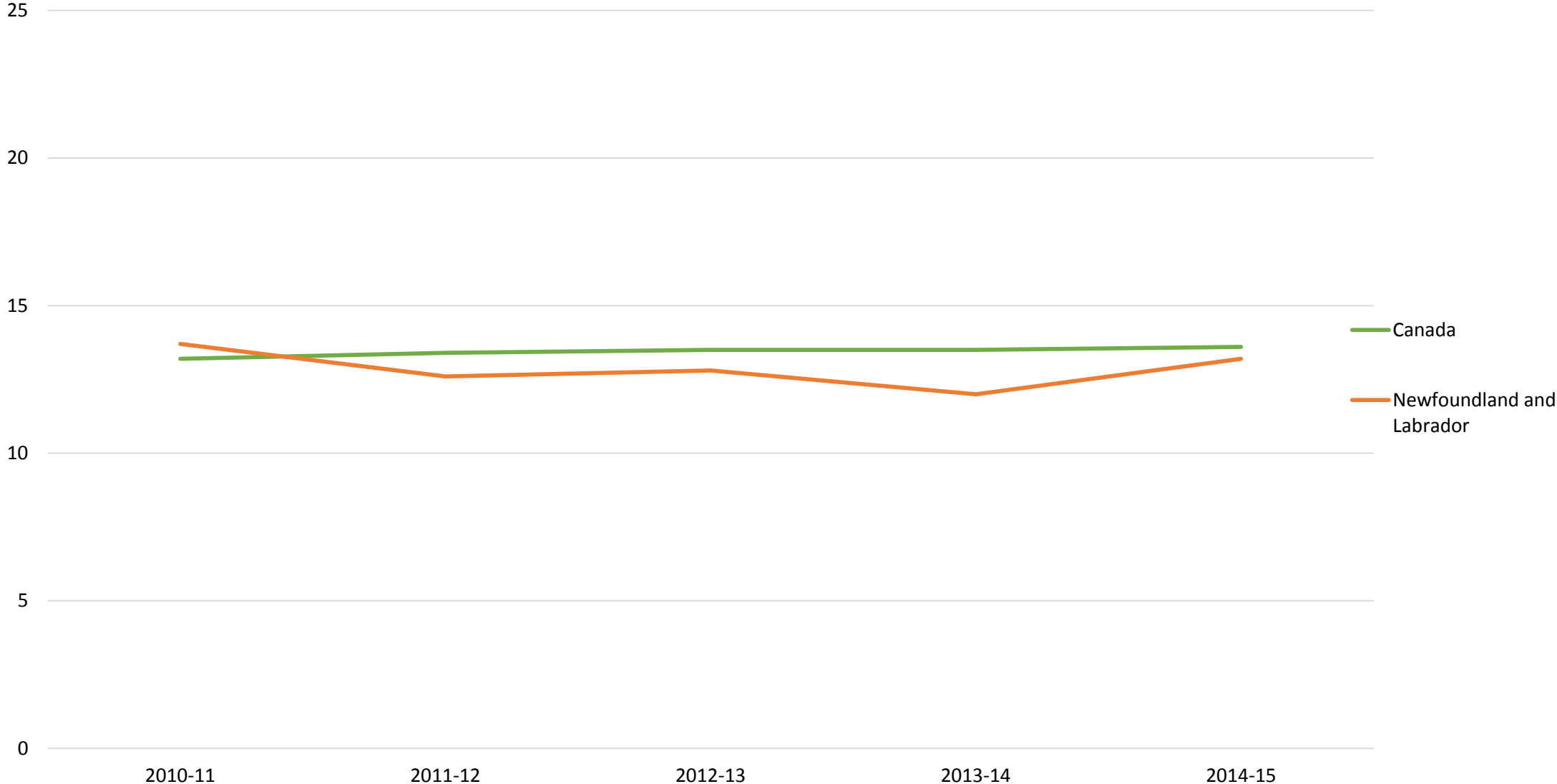
Readmissions – Medical Patients (NL and RHAs)

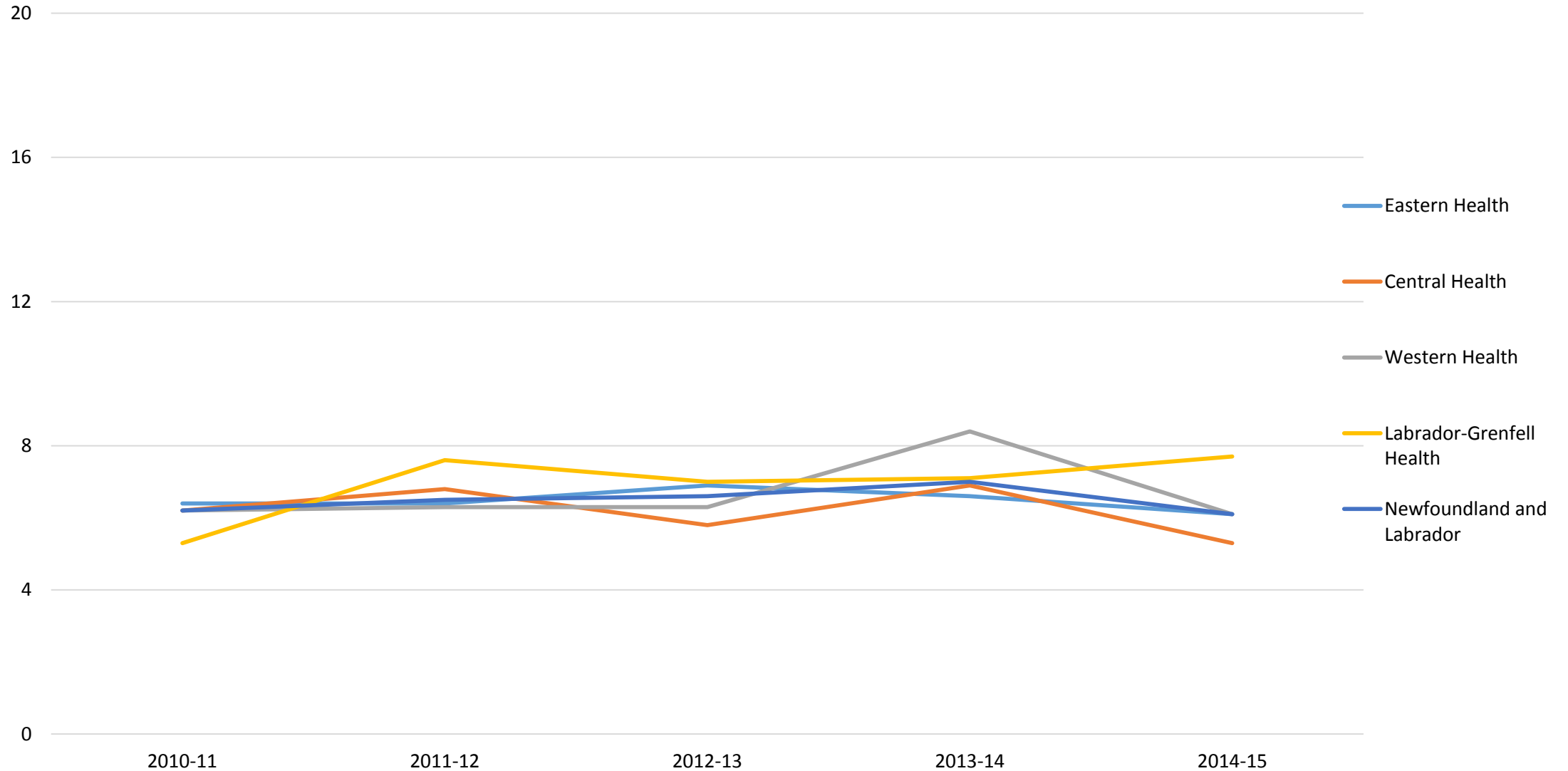
Percent Readmitted to Hospital within 30 Days of Discharge

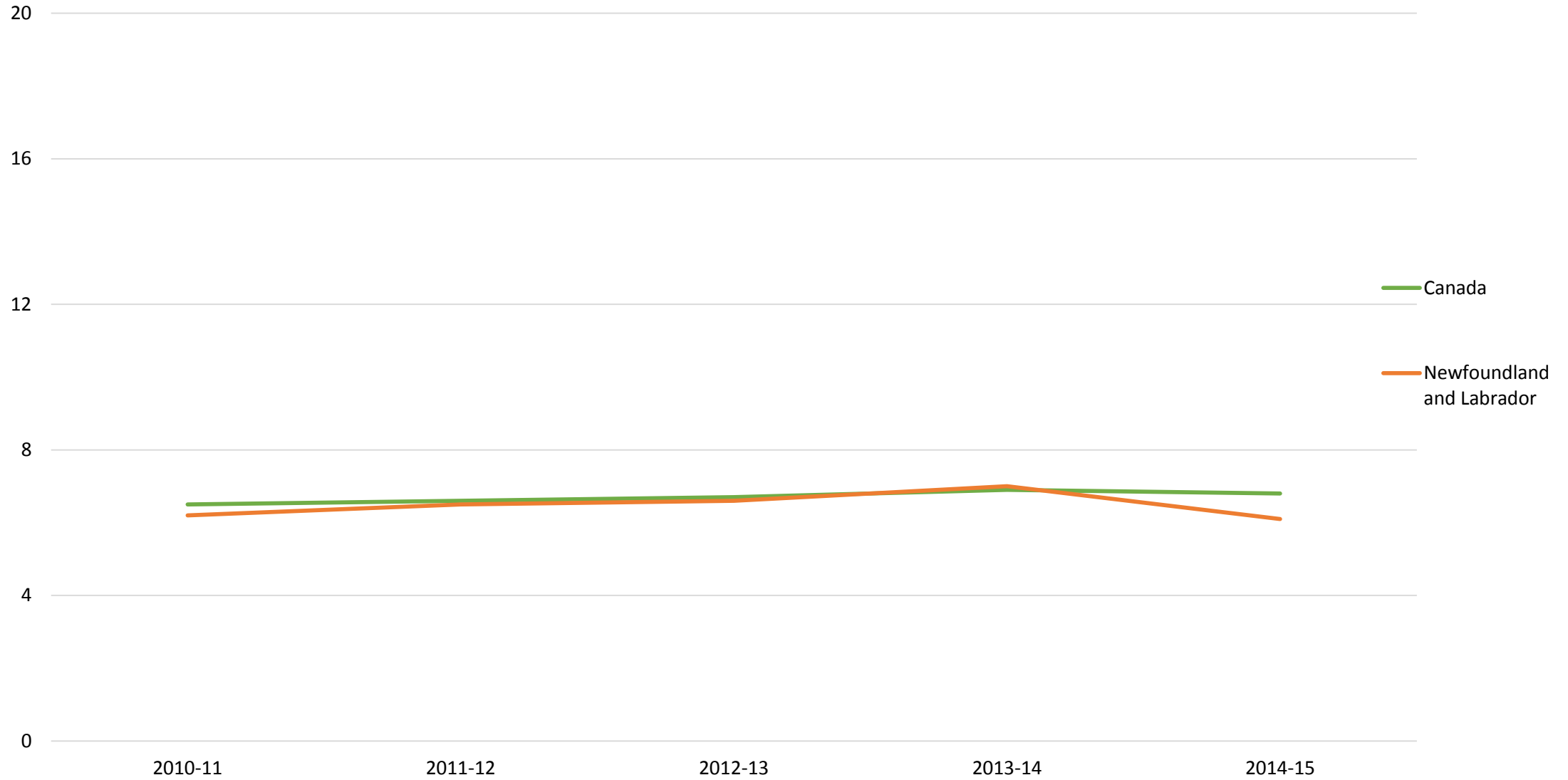
Percent Readmitted to Hospital within 30 Days of Discharge

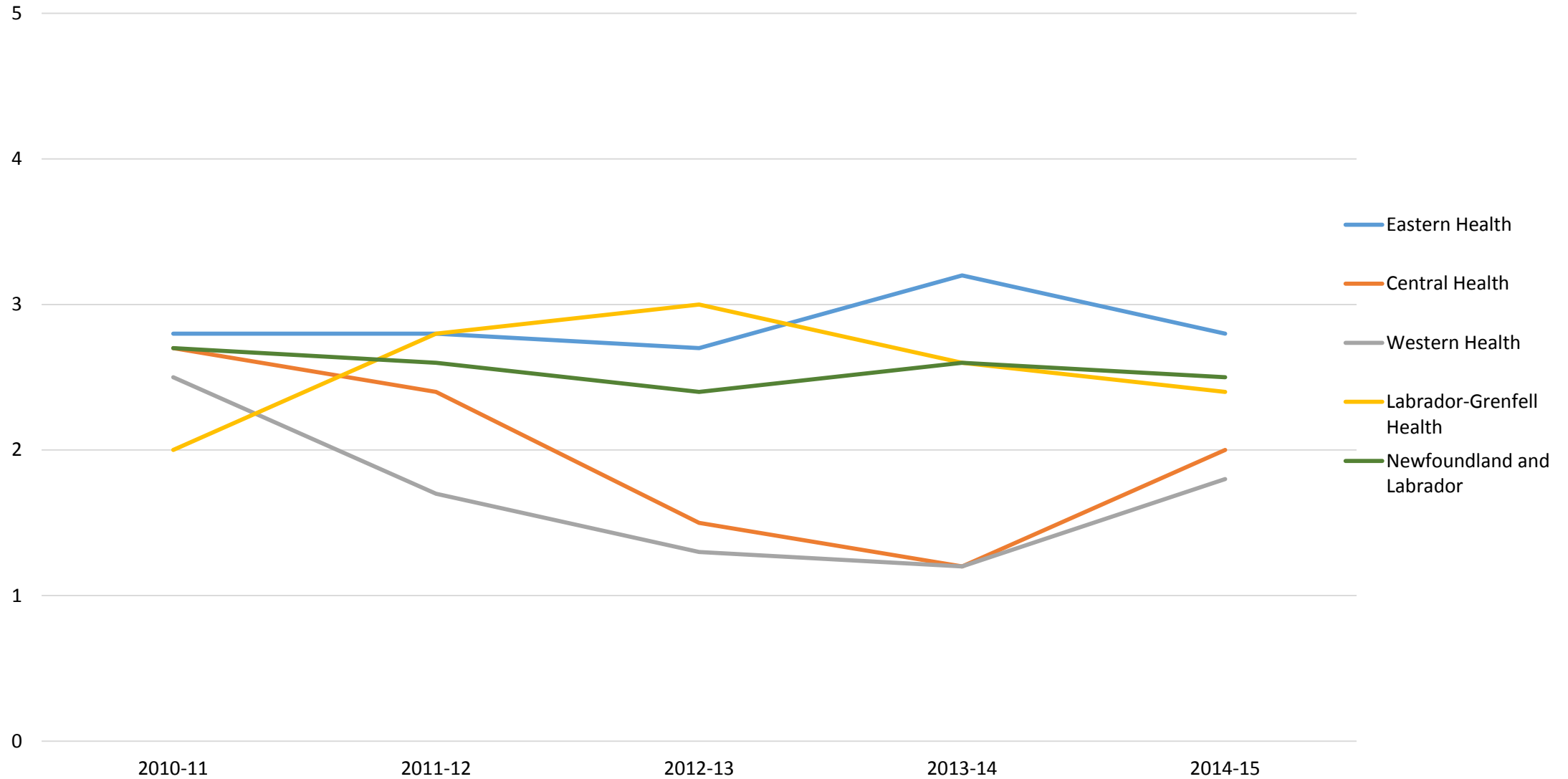
Percent Readmitted to Hospital within 30 Days of Discharge

Readmissions – Obstetrics Patients (NL and RHAs)

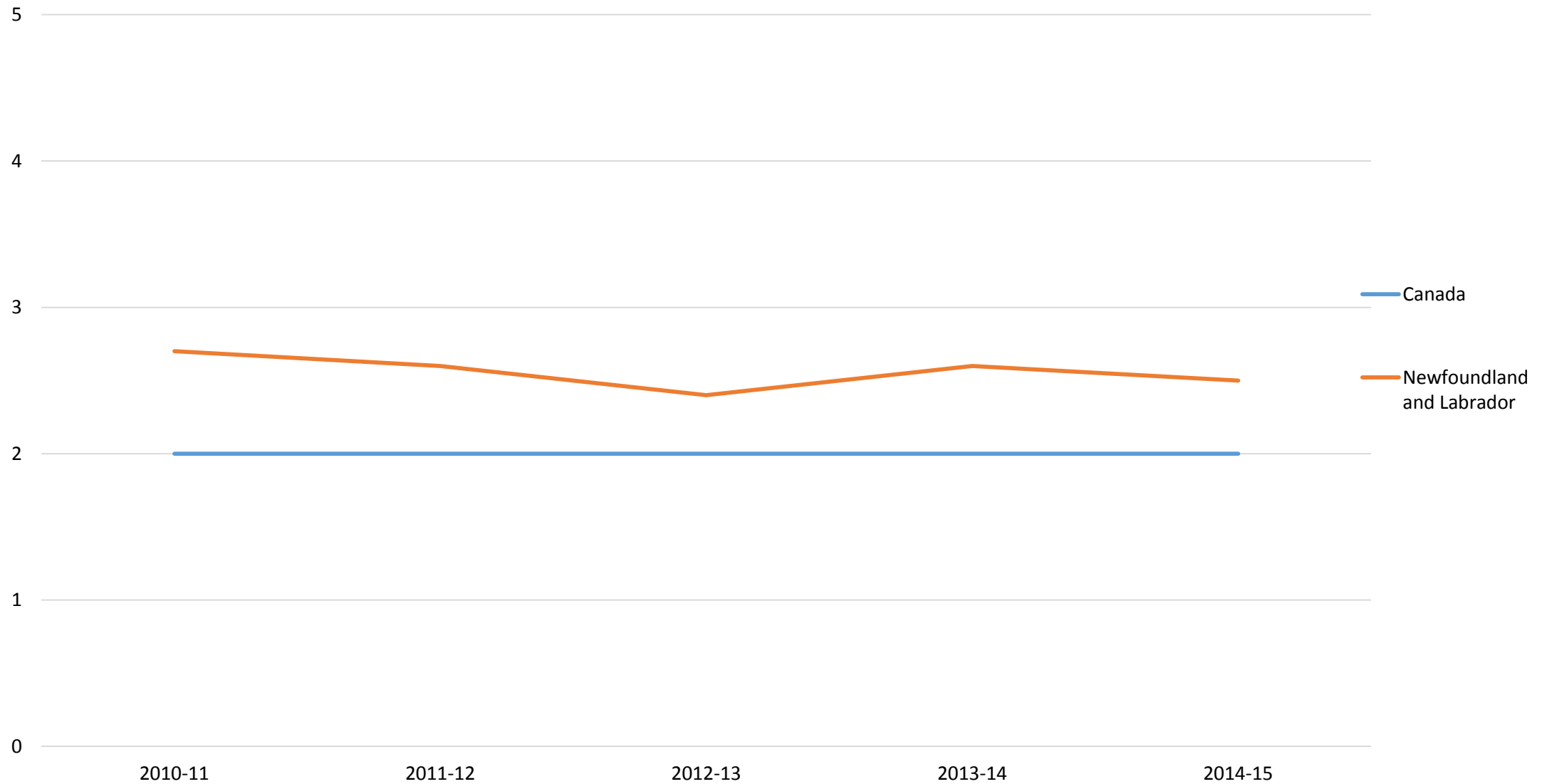
Percent Readmitted to Hospital within 30 Days of Discharge

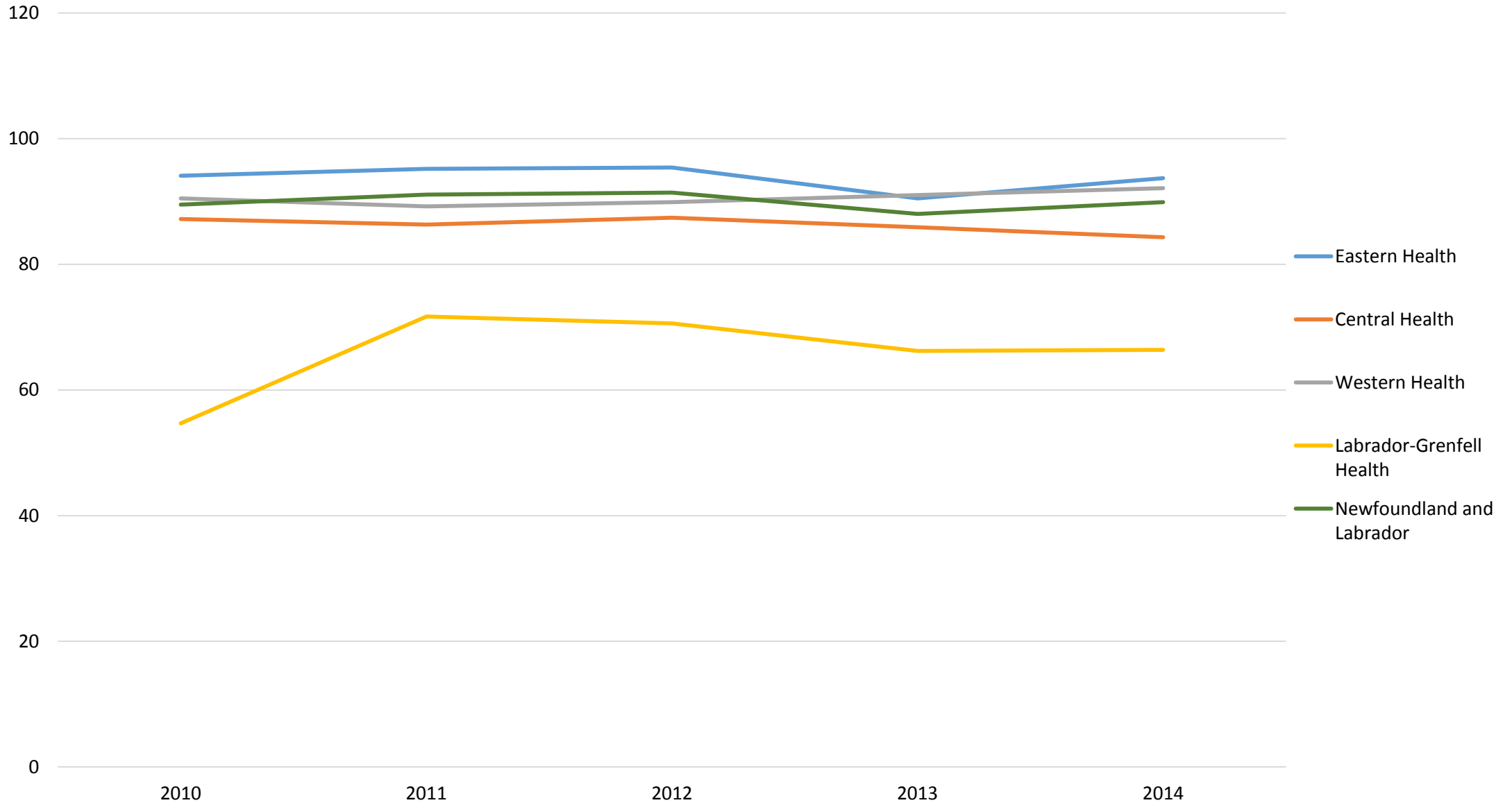

Percent Readmitted to Hospital within 30 Days of Discharge



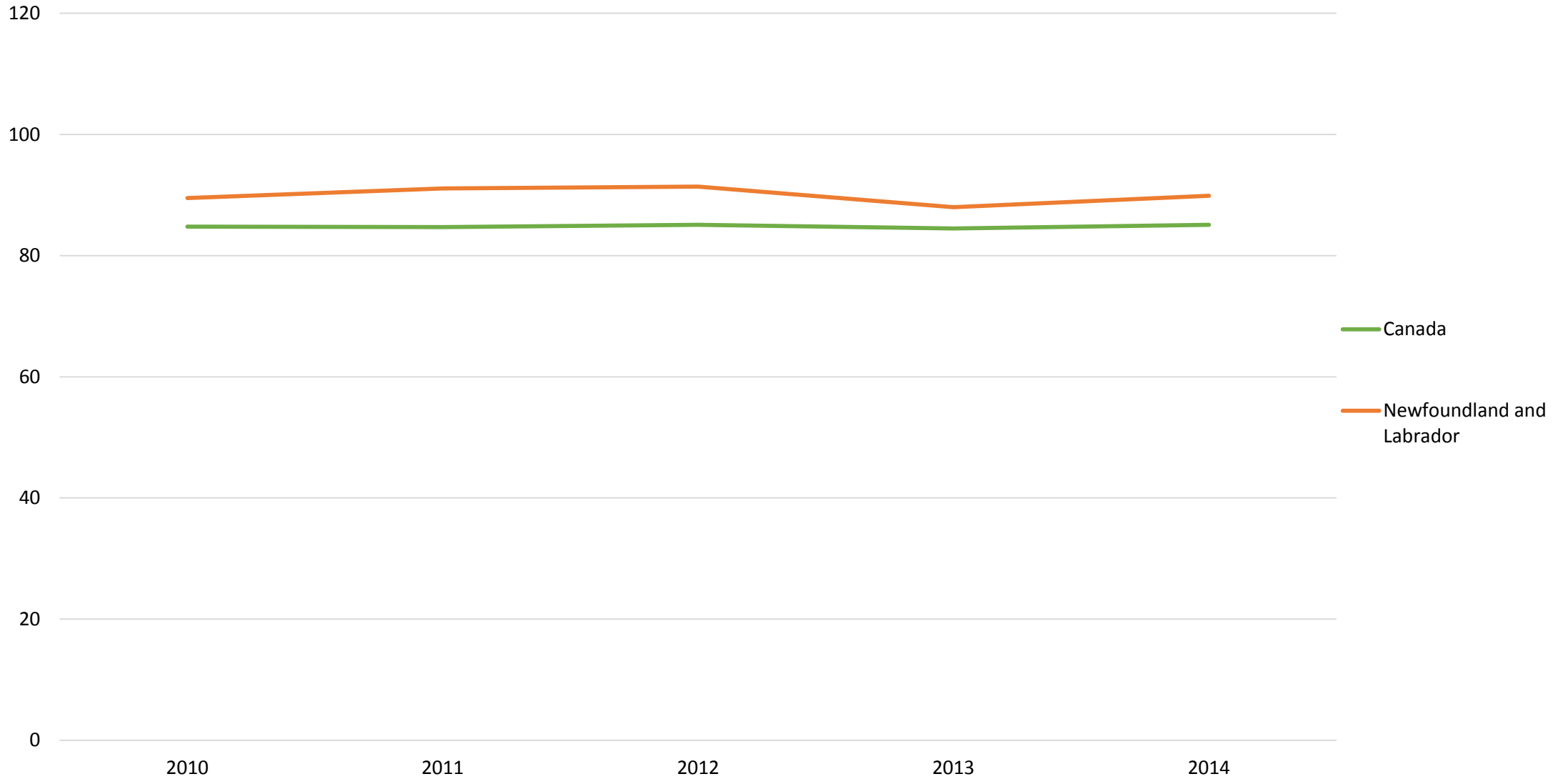

Percent of Population with a Medical Doctor (NL and RHAs)



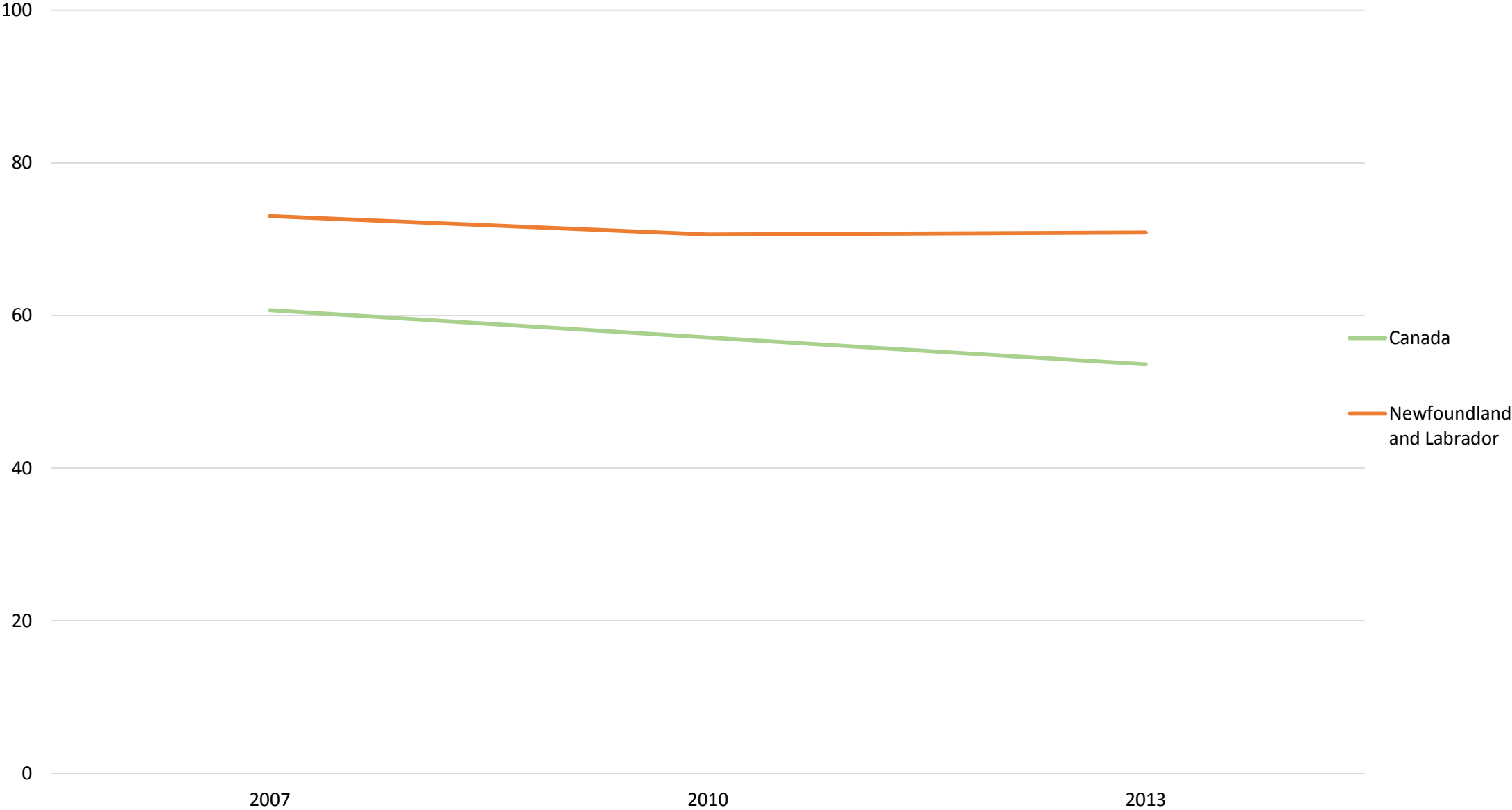

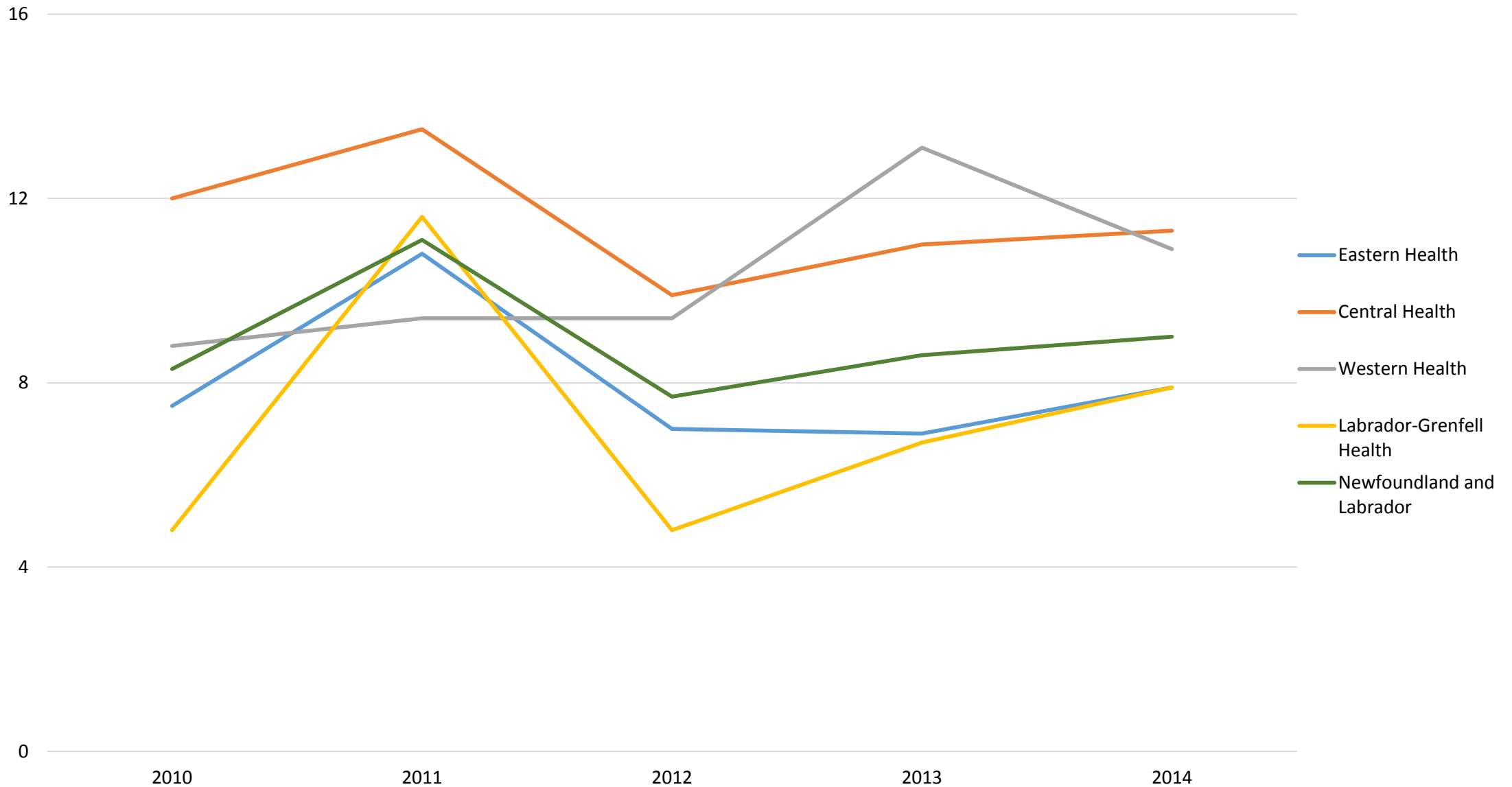
Percent of pop. who have difficulty obtaining after-hours PC (NL and Canada)

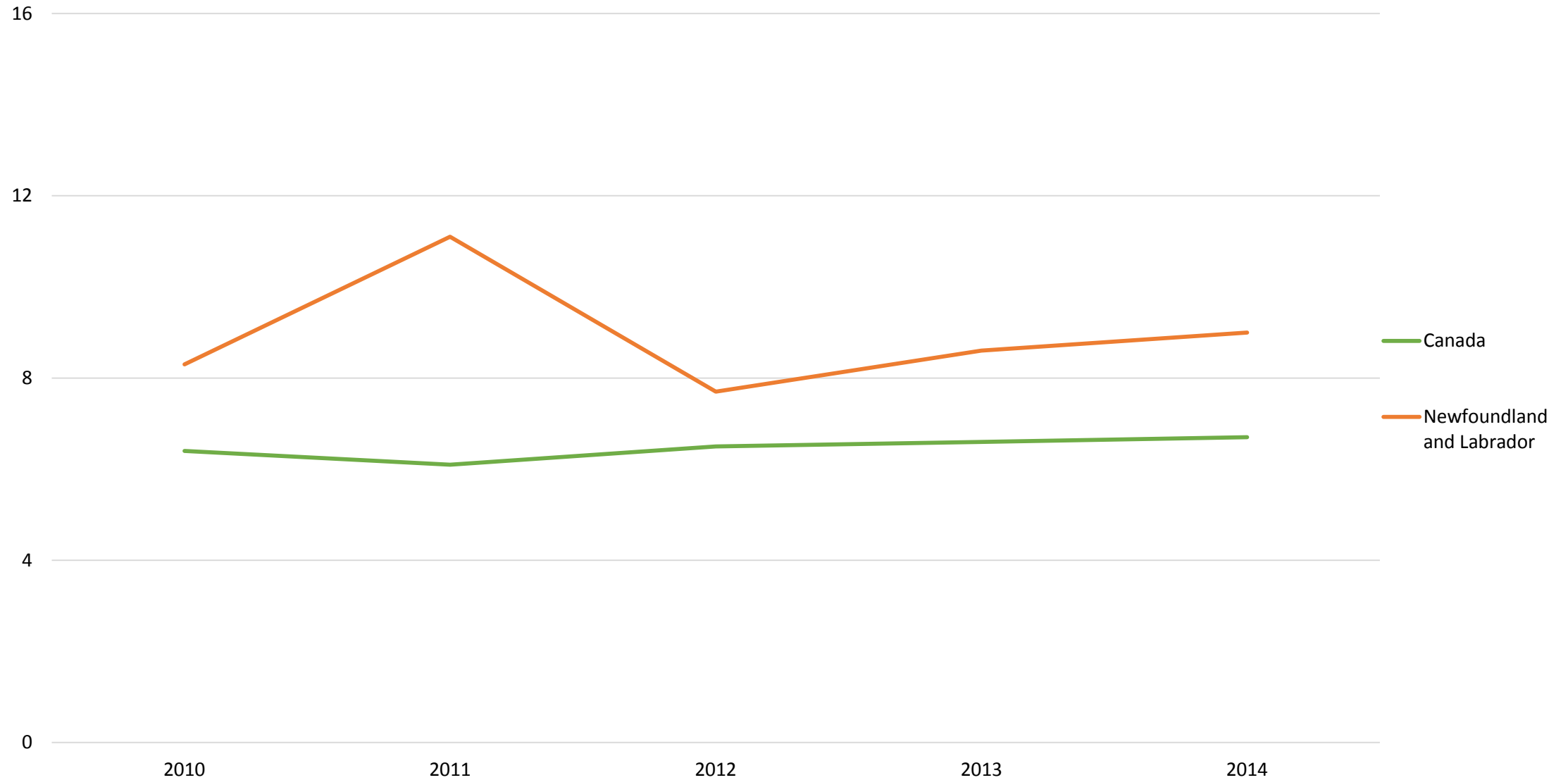

Percent of Population with Diabetes (NL and RHAs)



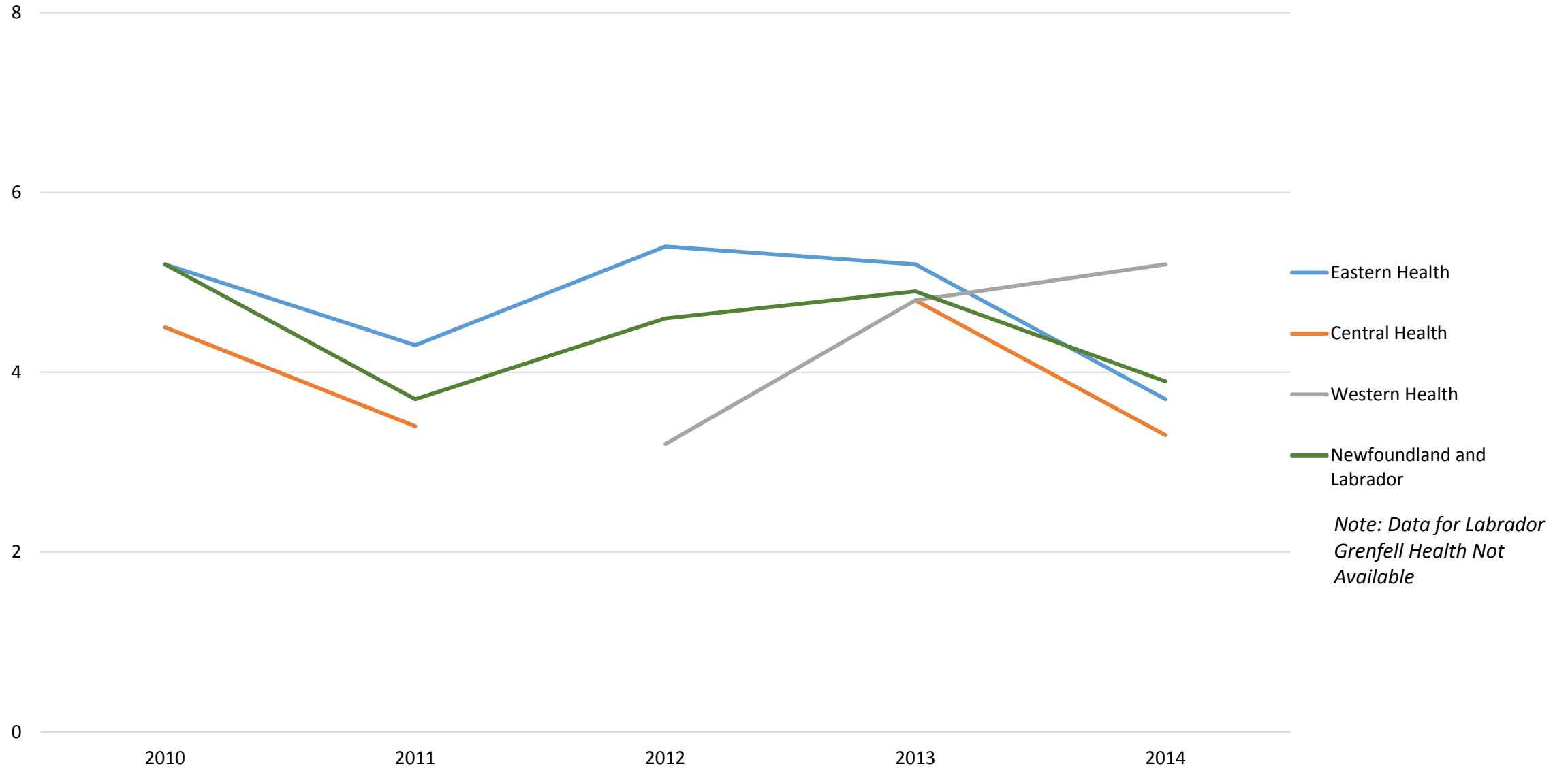

Percent of Population with Diabetes (NL and Canada)

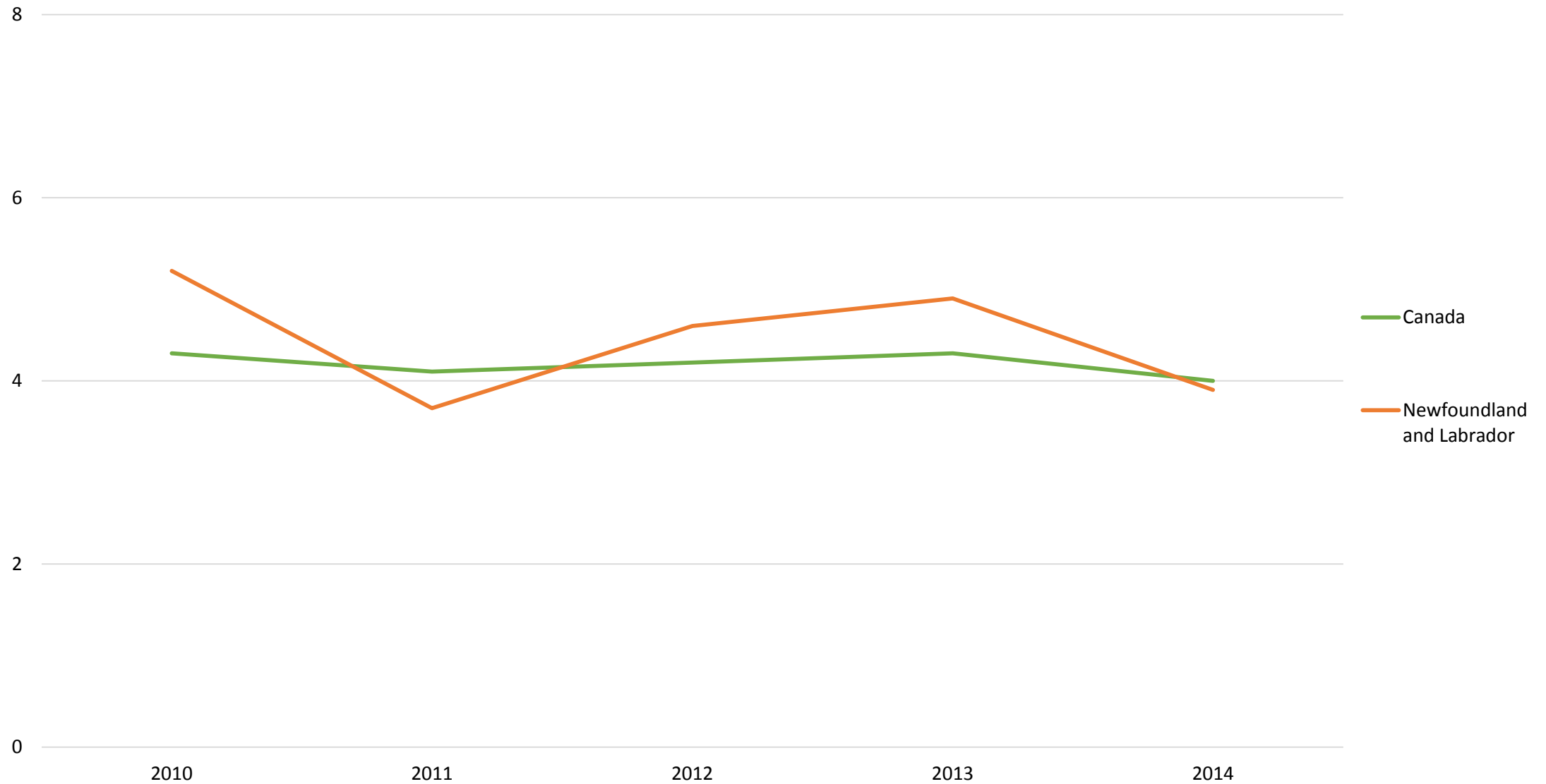

Percent of Population with COPD (NL and RHAs)

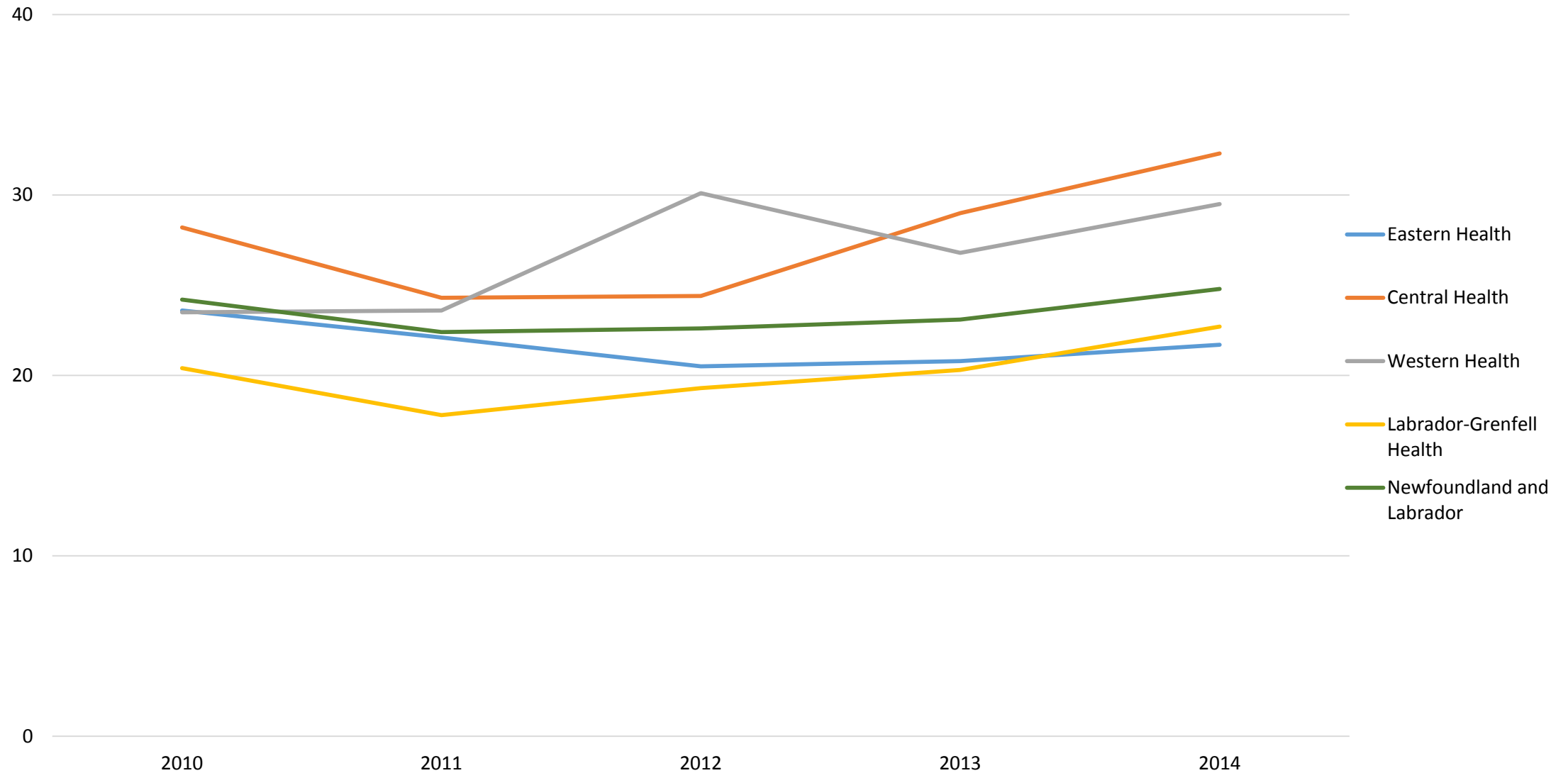


Percent of Population with COPD (NL and Canada)



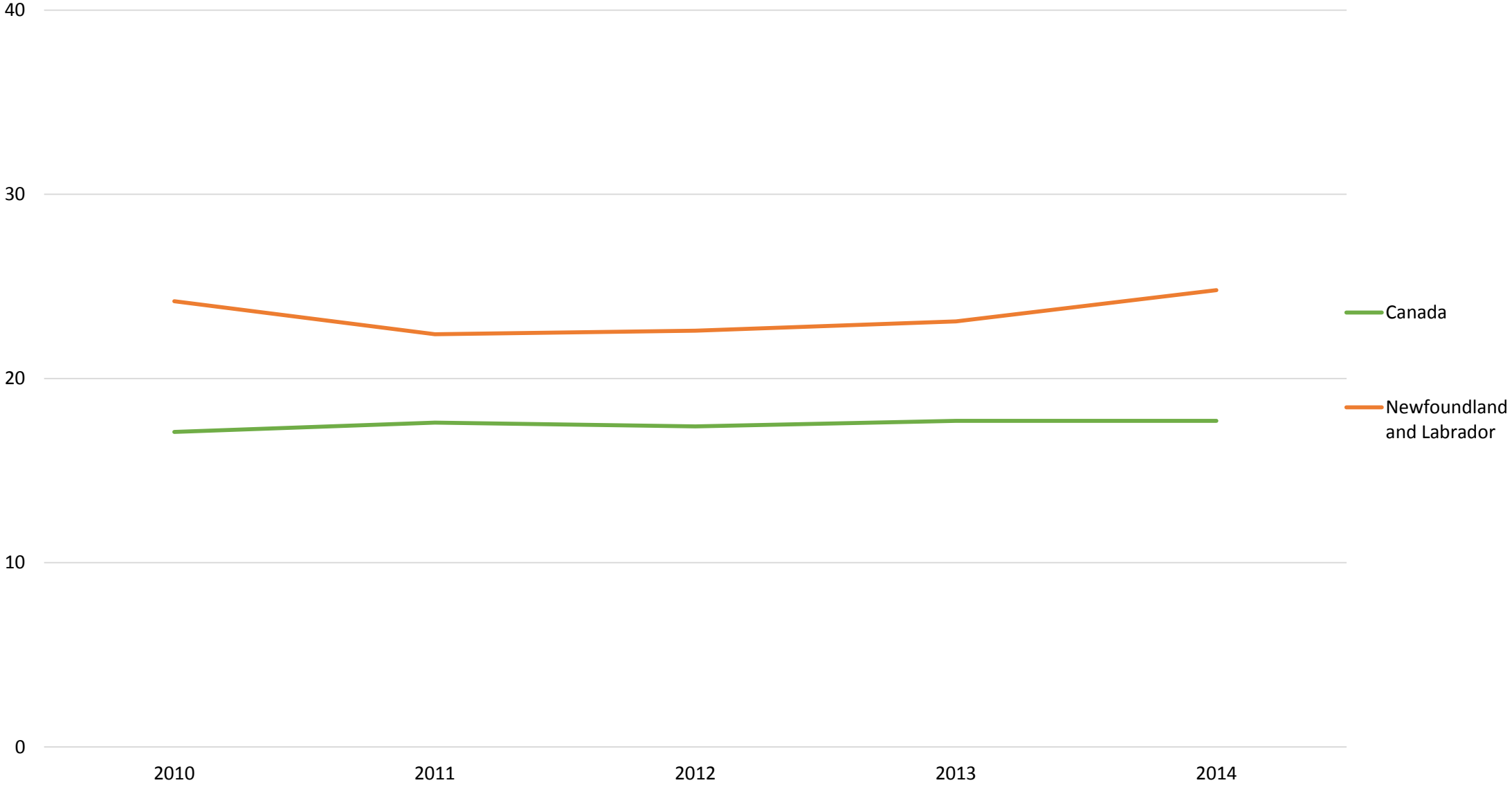

Percent of Population with High Blood Pressure (NL and RHAs)



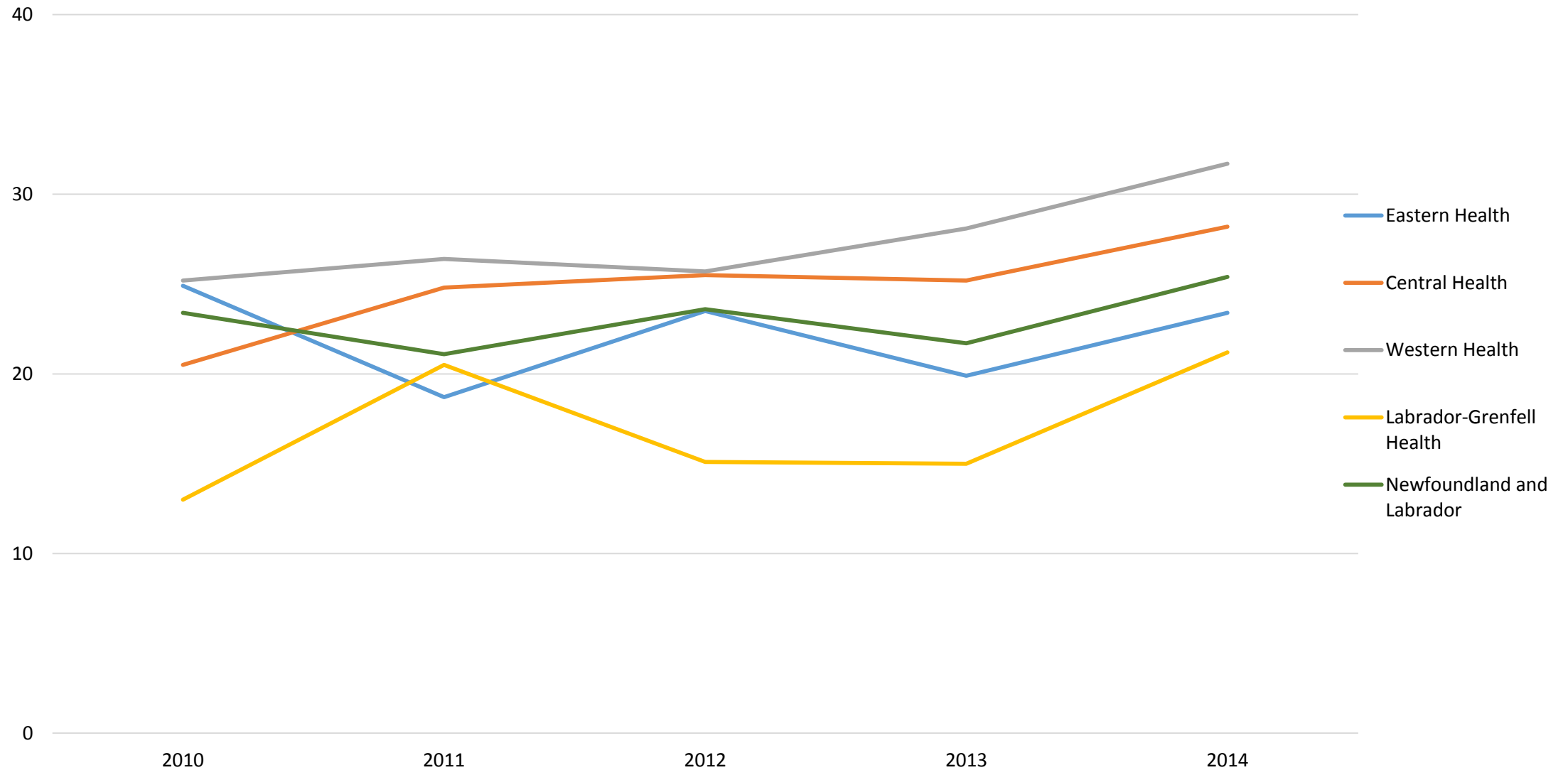

Percent of Population with High Blood Pressure (NL and Canada)



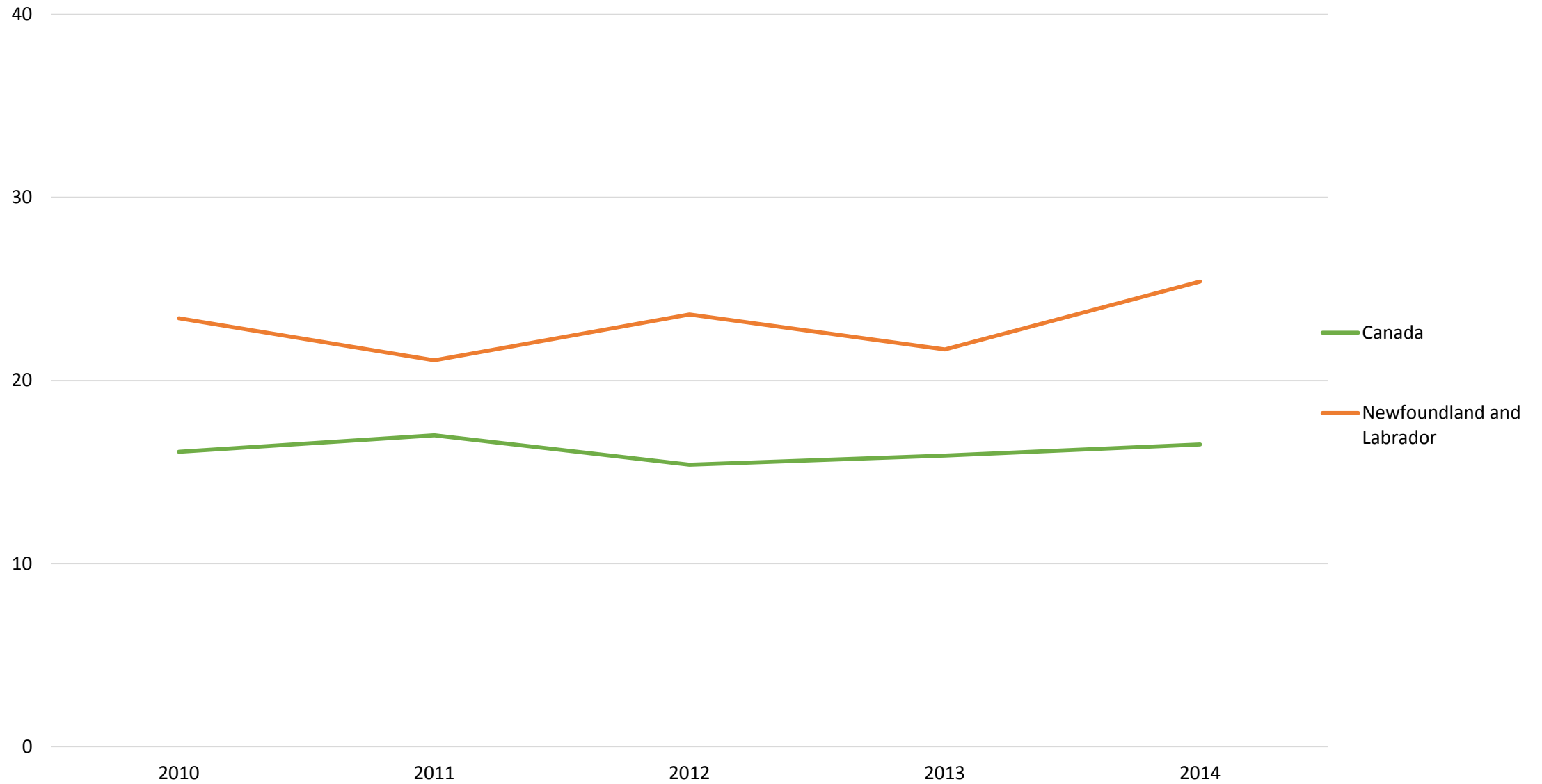

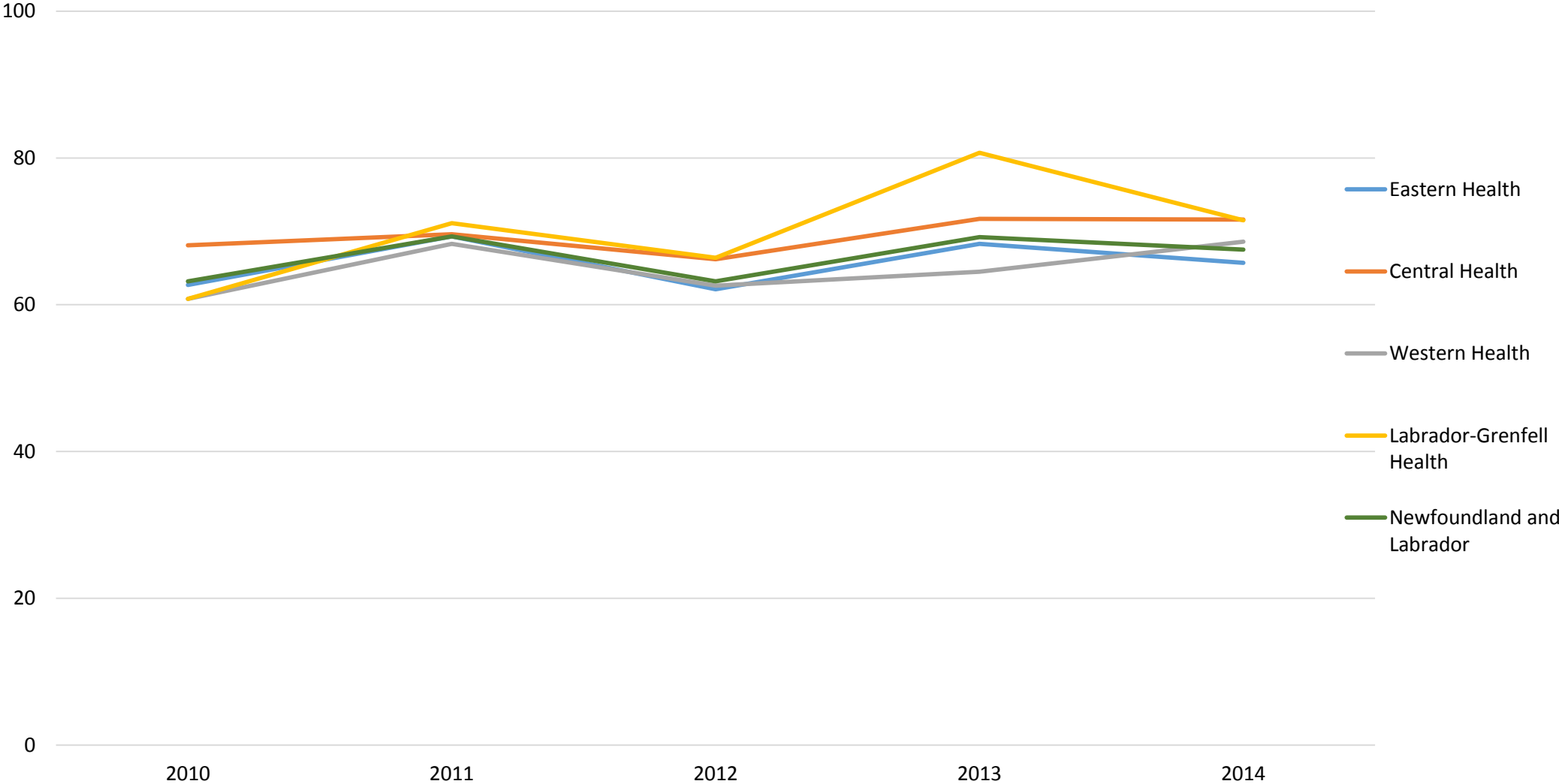

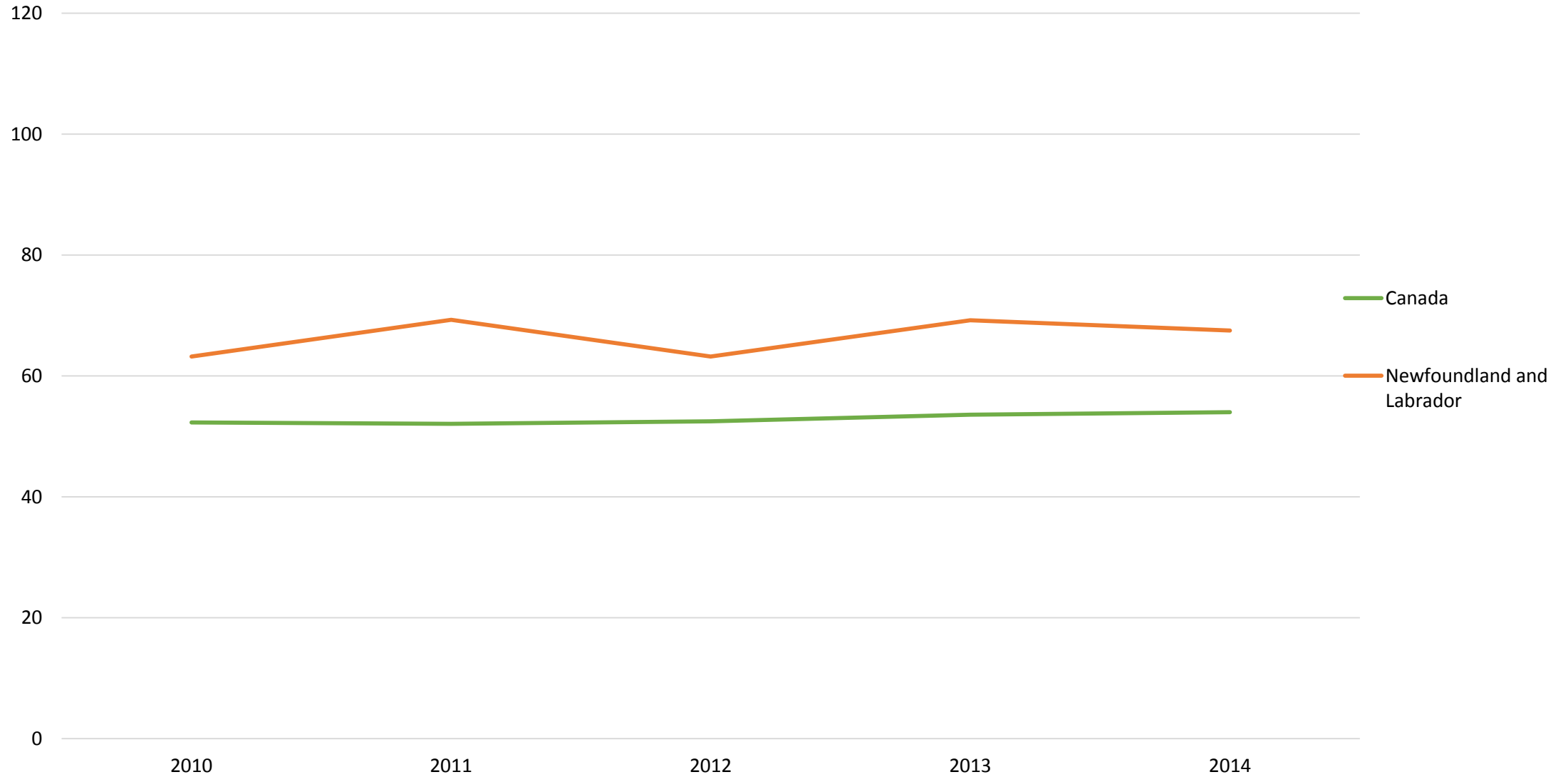
Percent of Adult (18 years+) Population with Self-reported BMI Overweight or Obese

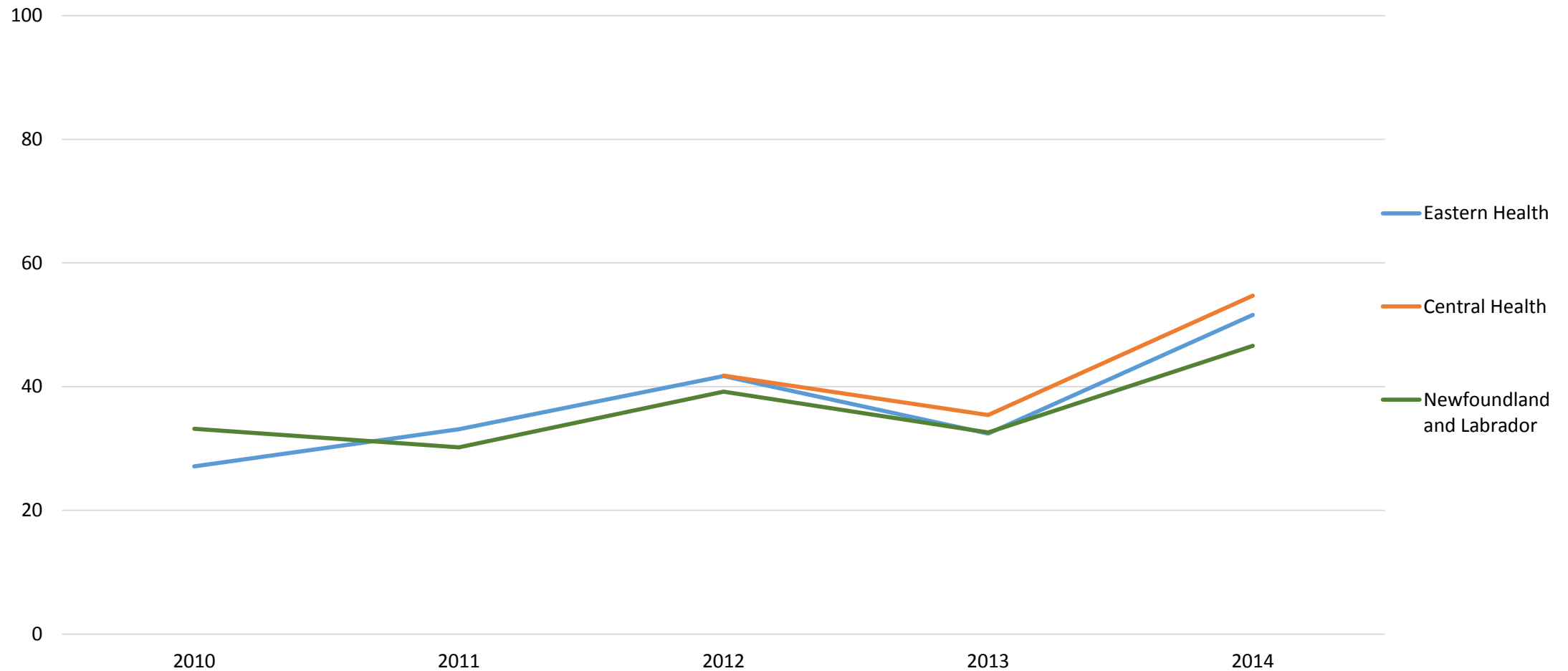
Percent of Adult (18 years+) Population with Self-reported BMI Overweight or Obese

Percent of Youth (ages 12-17) Population with Self-reported BMI of Overweight or Obese

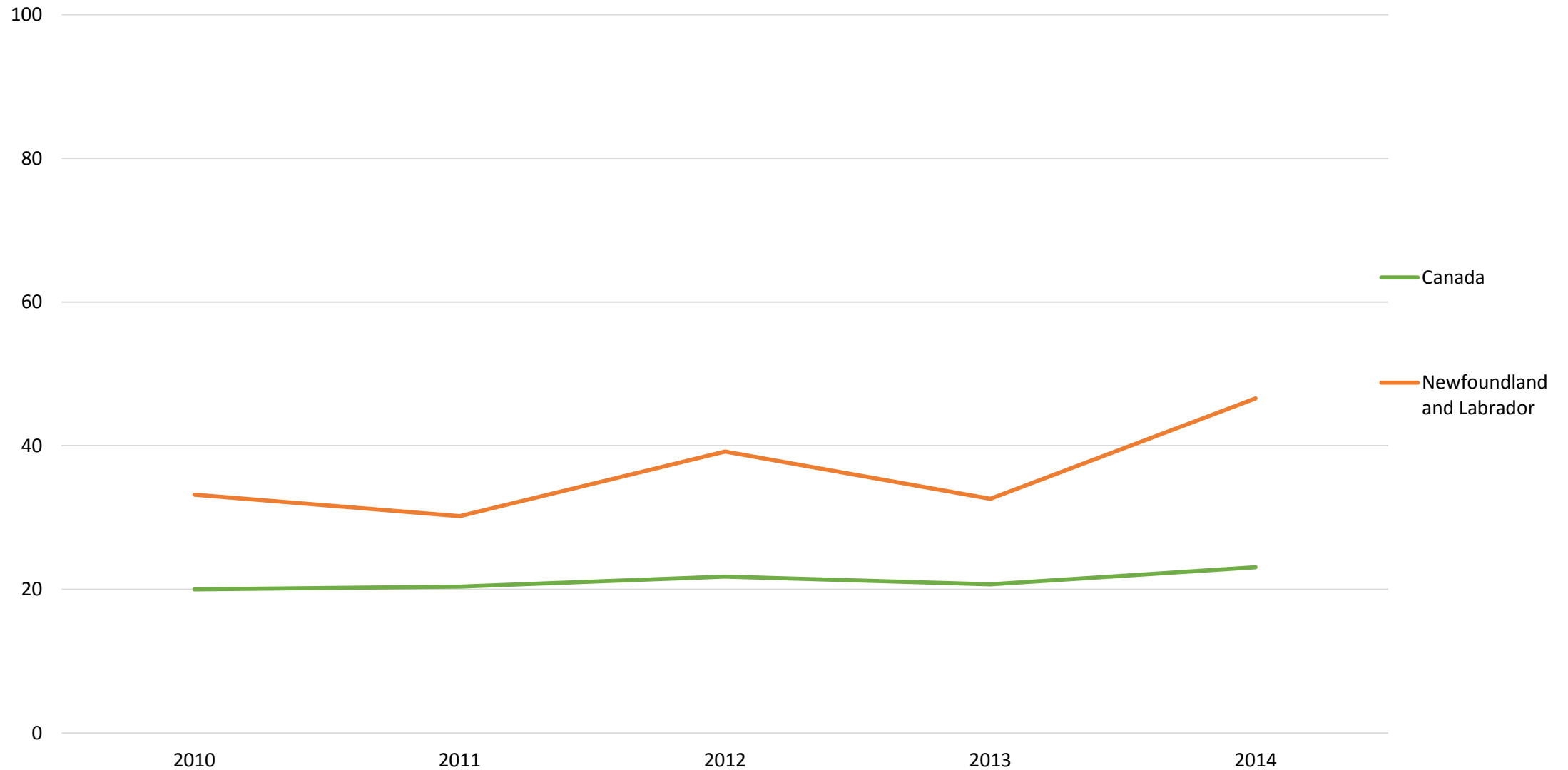

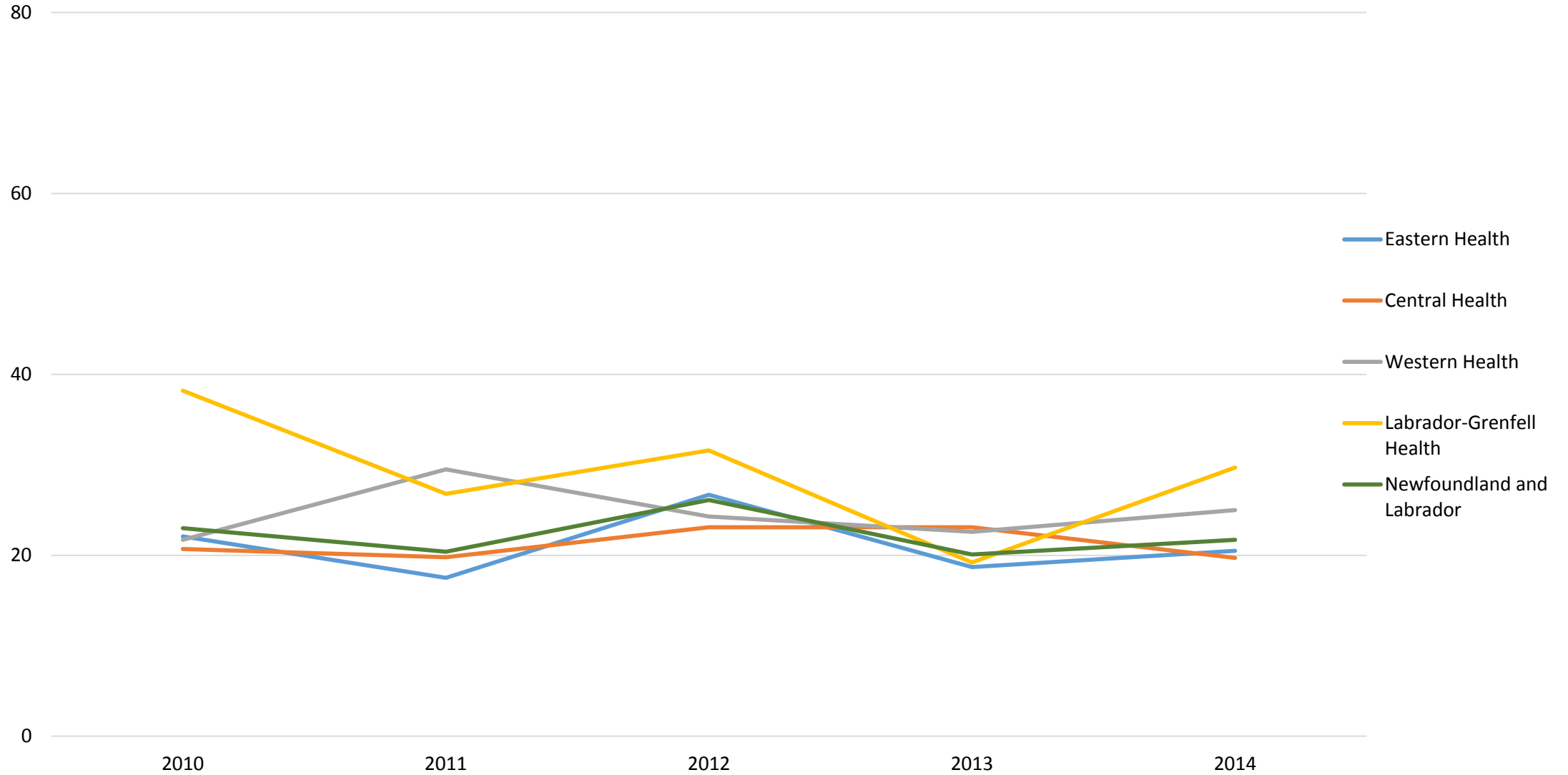
Percent of Youth (ages 12-17) Population with Self-reported BMI of Overweight or Obese

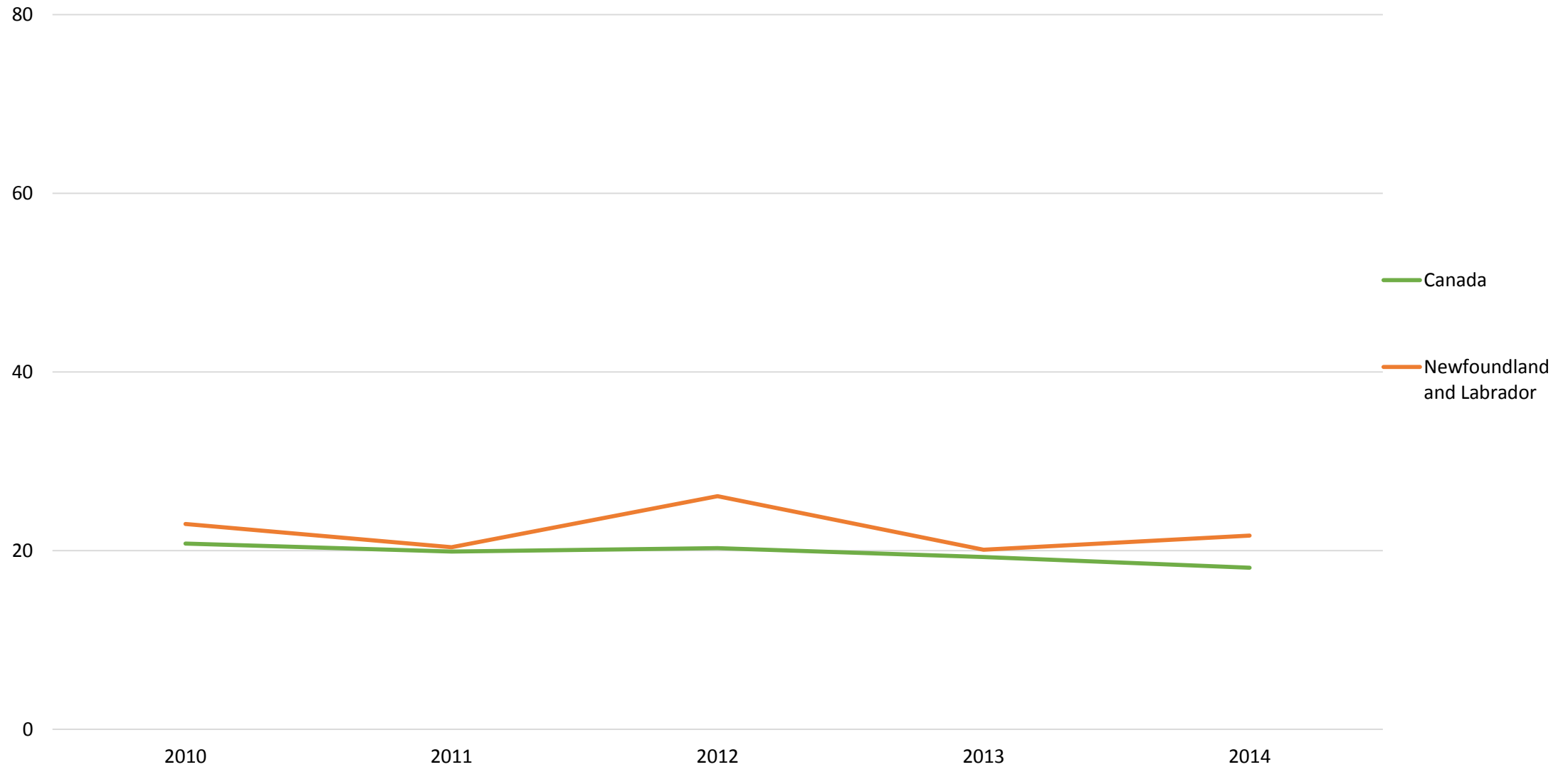
Percent of Population who Currently Smoke - Daily or Occasional

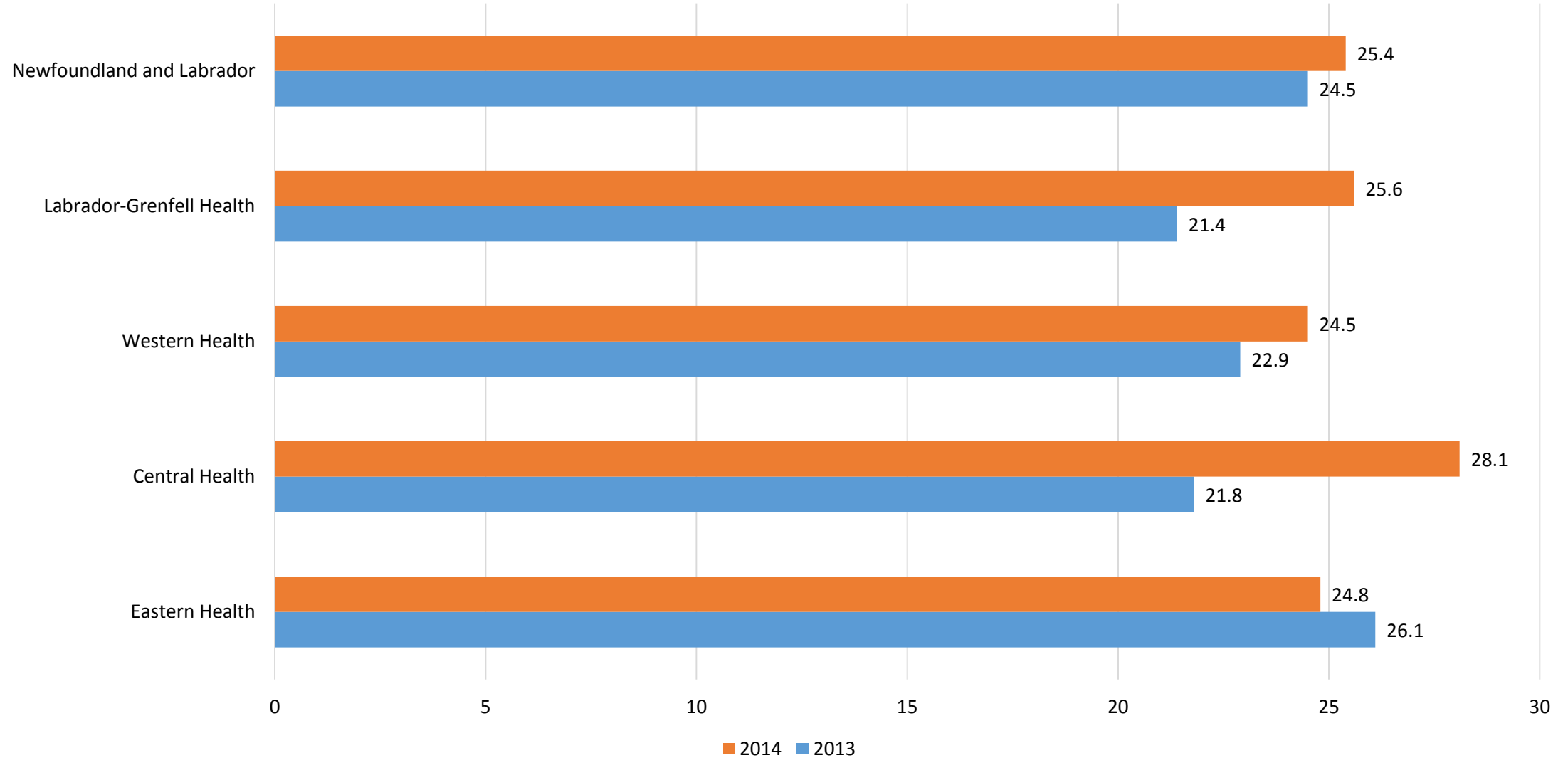
Percent of Population who Currently Smoke - Daily or Occasional

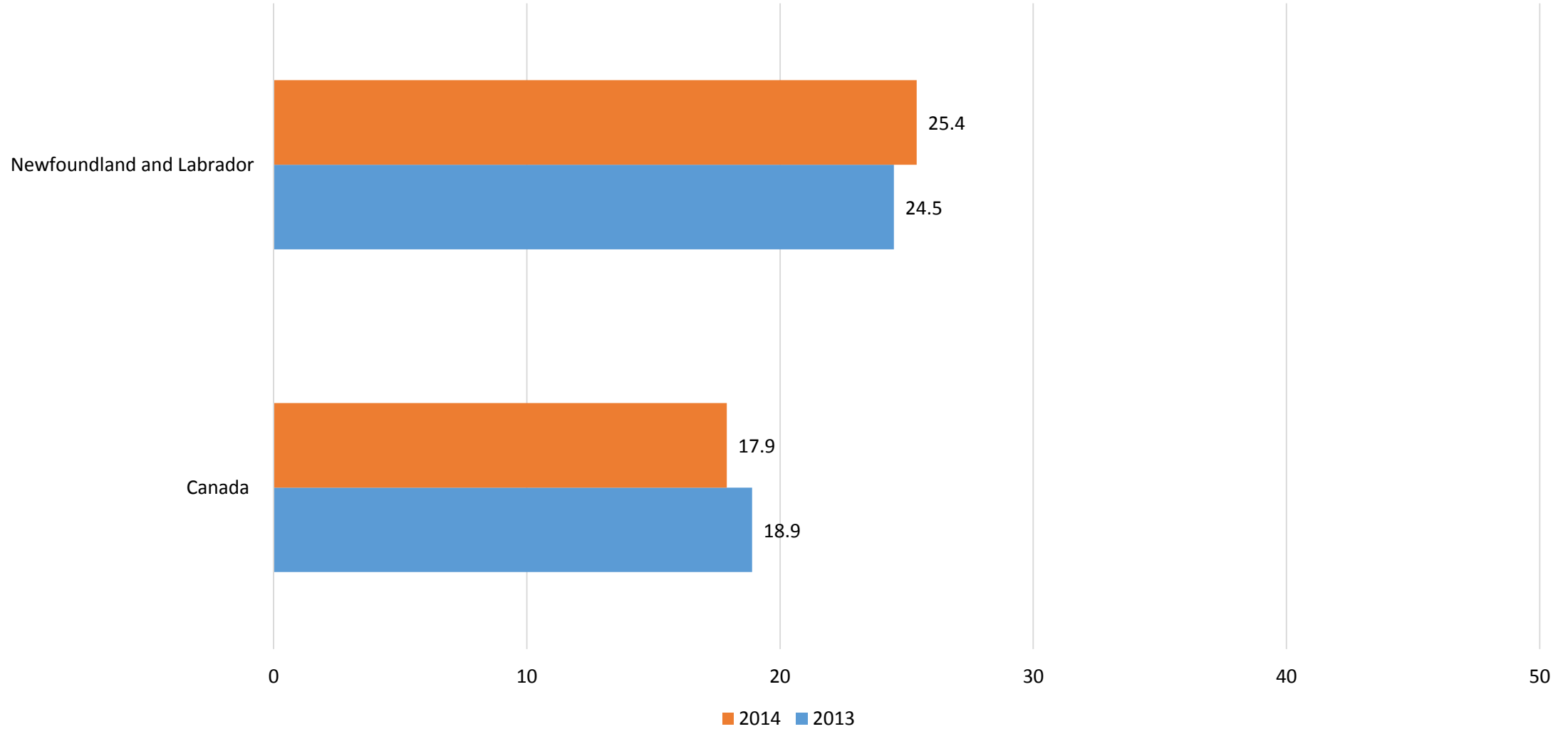
Self-reported Percent of Population

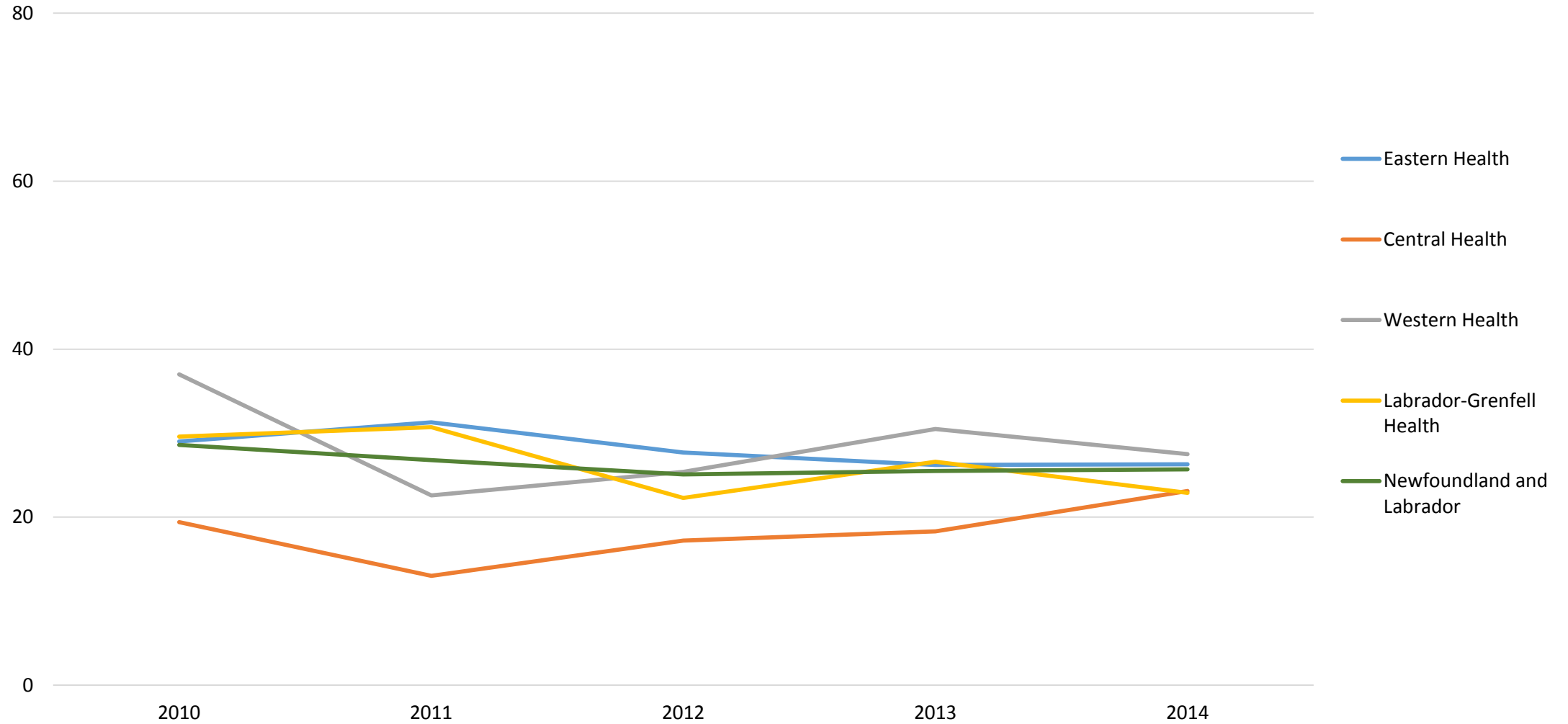

Self-reported Percent of Population



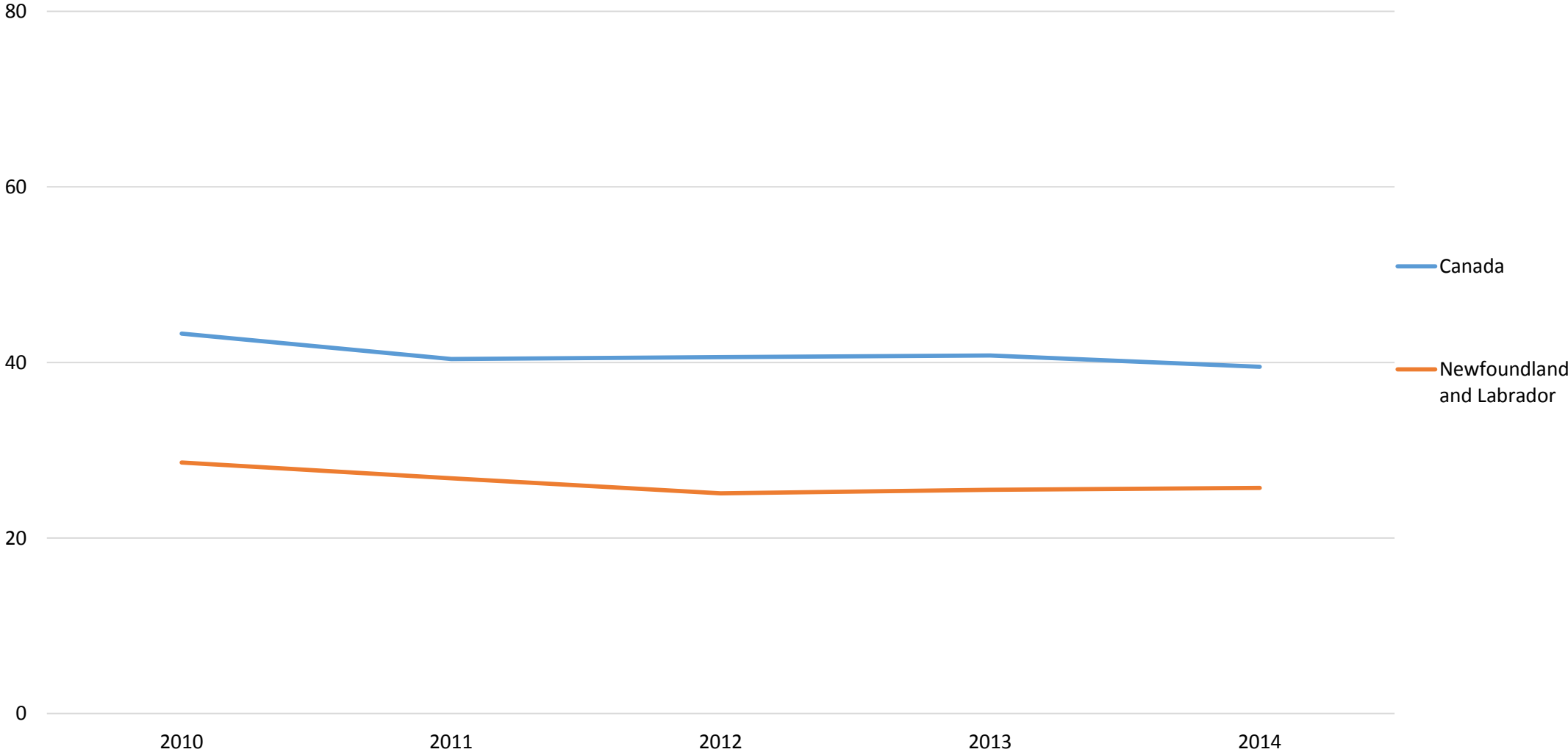

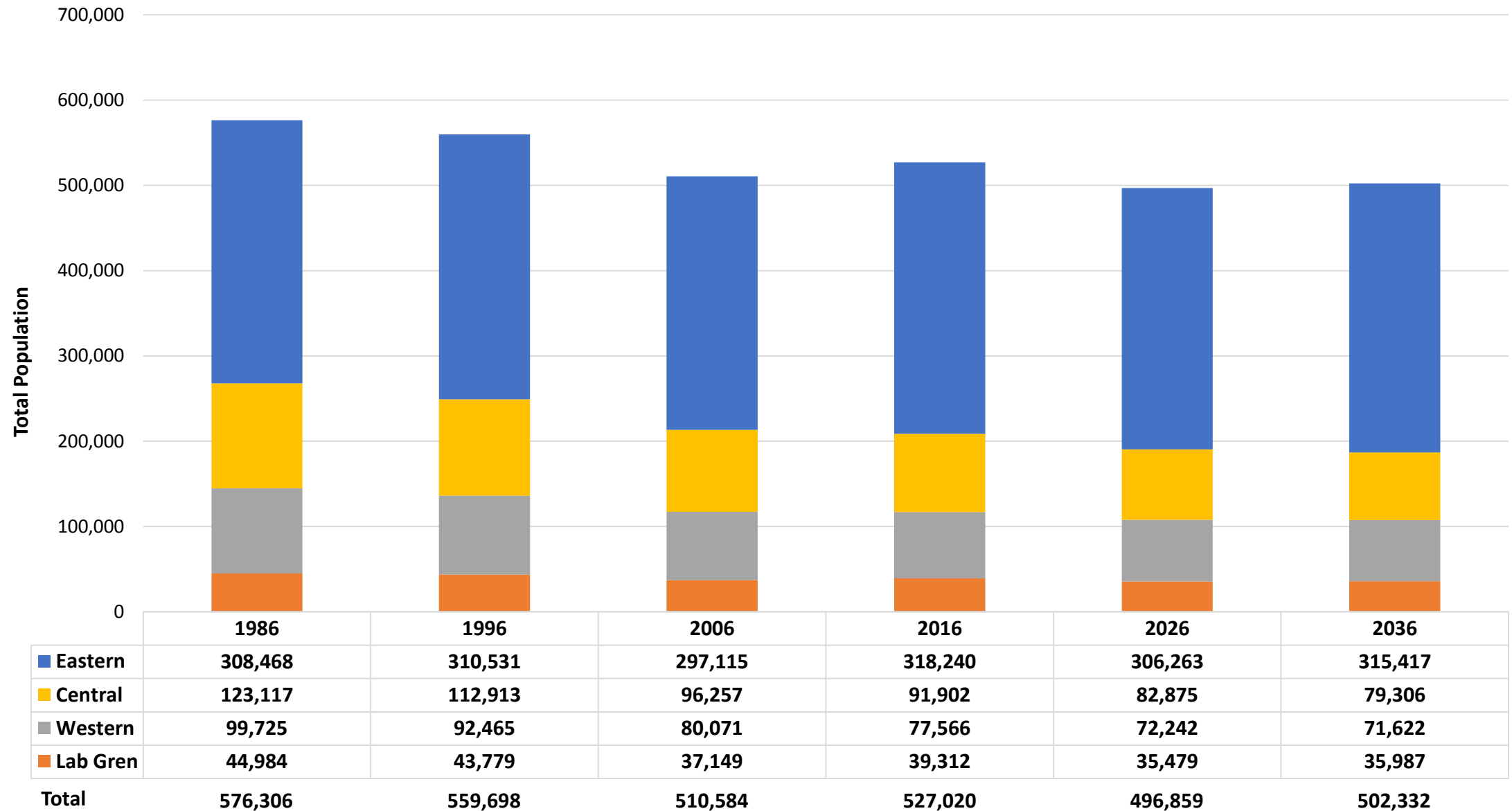

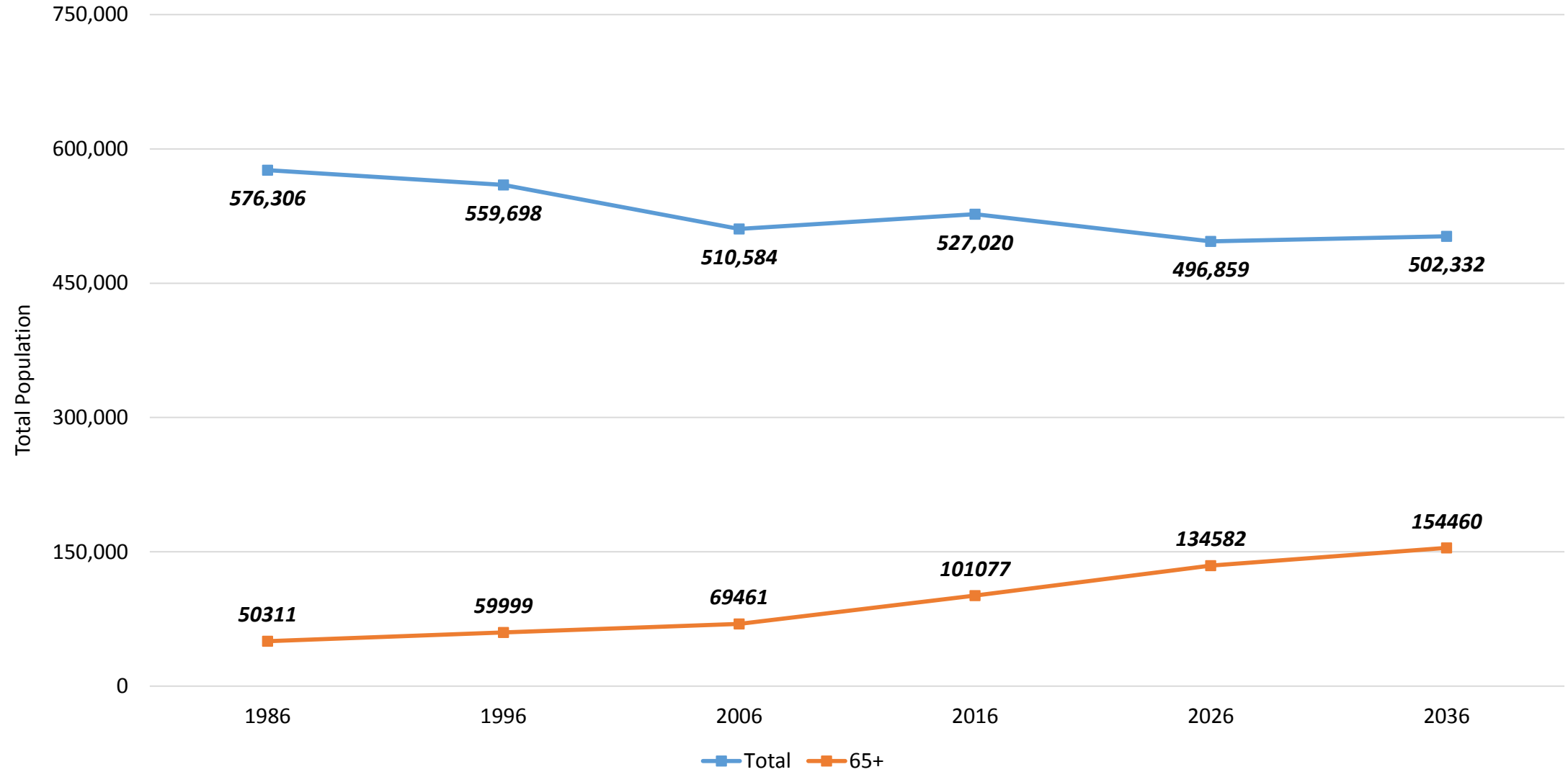

Population Projections by RHA, Medium Scenario, July 2016



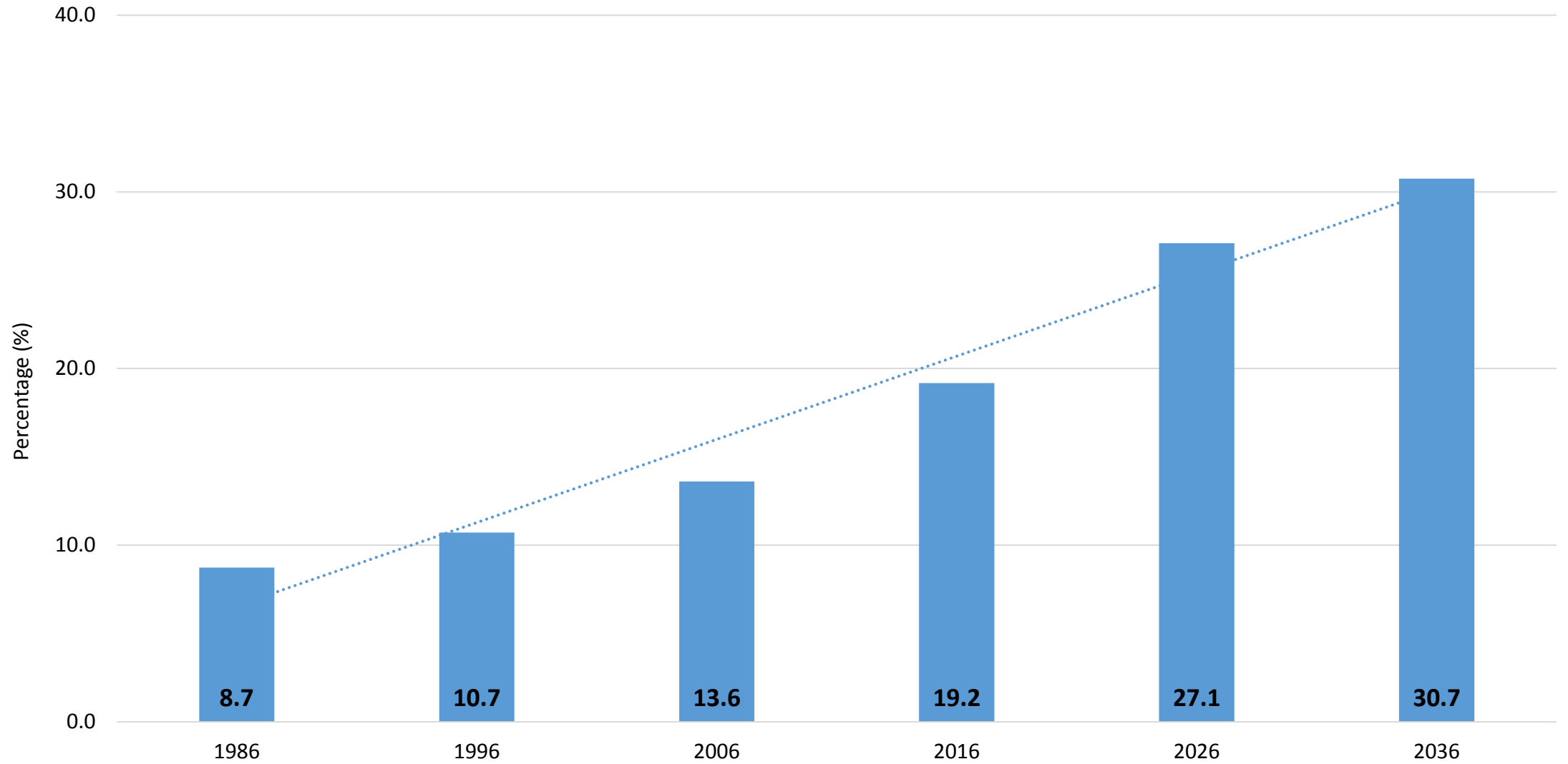

NL Population over 65 years, July 2016



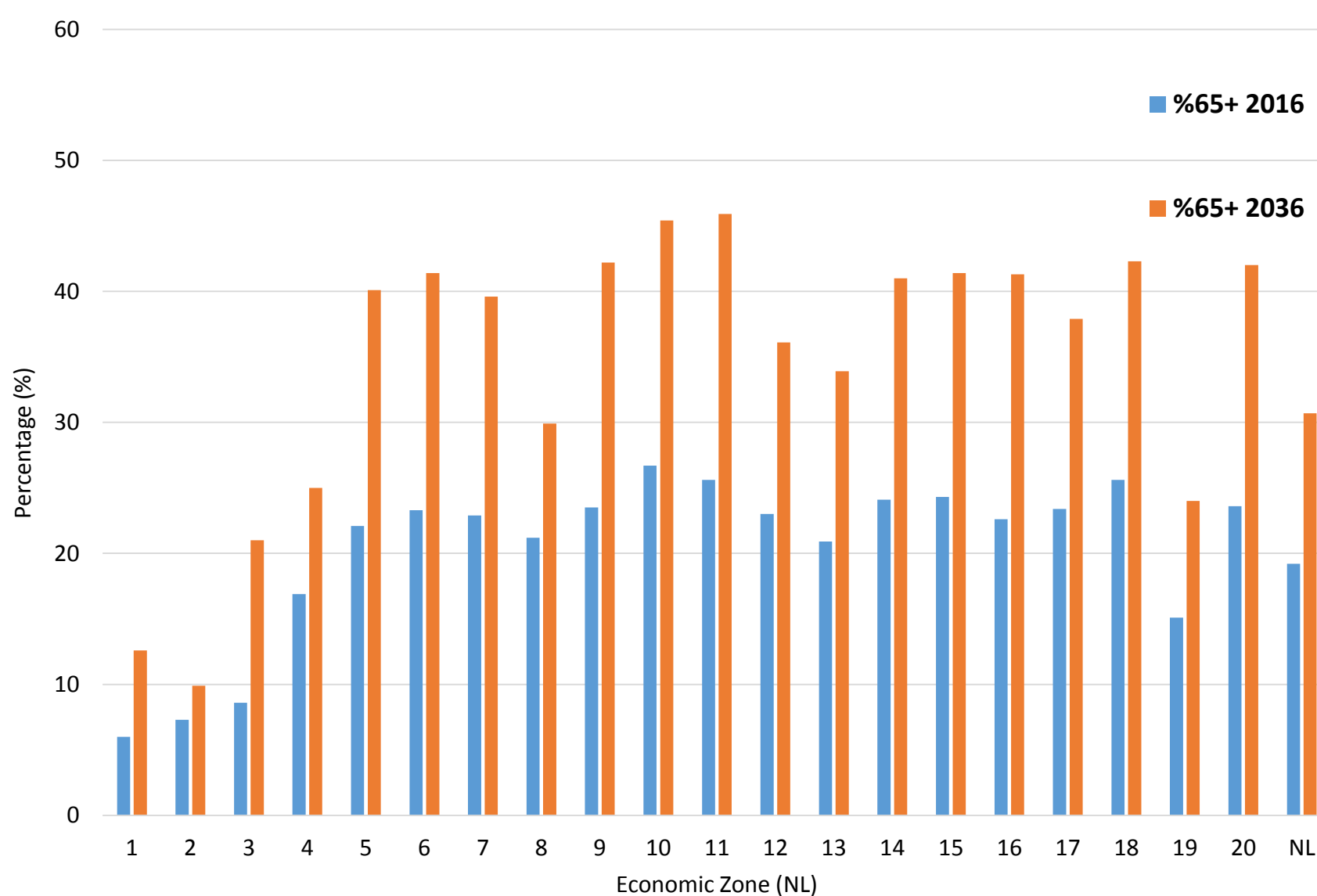
