The NLMA is requesting that the RHAs discontinue the issuing of paper results for diagnostic imaging and other clinical documentation to physicians who are using Med Access, with the exception of those results that are not available in HEALTHe NL.

The rollout of eDOCSNL has been very successful and well received by physicians. The integration of HEALTHe NL with Med Access has been a great selling point for the EMR program both from the immediate availability of this information and the promise of no longer receiving paper results.

Unfortunately, there is still a large and costly duplication of results that go in paper format to physicians who also receive them through EMR. This situation is an unnecessary administrative burden on physicians, as there is an obligation that they check through all these duplicate communications, and it is costly for the RHAs. By continuing to receive unnecessary paper results there is also a higher risk that physicians may miss the results that are not included in HEALTHE NL, such as genetic testing.

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The NLMA is now requesting that the RHAs take the final step and stop delivering paper results for diagnostic imaging and other clinical documentation. Once this is completed, physicians will have almost 100% of results and clinical documentation within their EMR when they are identified as one of the patient's providers.

If the RHAs concentrate on ensuring all results are included in HEALTHe NL, contacting physicians directly with critical results, and communicating to physicians that all results are in HEALTHe NL we will have achieved one of the key goals of the EMR system.
