Clinical Educator Family Medicine faculty position at the level of Assistant Professor or above, depending on experience, are available. This position is eligible for promotion in accordance with Faculty of Medicine guidelines related to strong performance in education, leadership, research, and clinical excellence.

Major academic responsibilities include undergraduate and residency education within the Discipline of Family Medicine and the Faculty of Medicine. Priorities for this position include enhancement of undergraduate Family Medicine training opportunities, resident support, resident assessment, extensions of training, and remediation in the Northern (Goose Bay) Stream.

Remuneration for this position allows for protected time for the expected scholarly activity in education, leadership, and research. Attainment of an advanced degree in either research or education is an expected component of the position being offered.

Candidates must be Certificants of the College of Family Physicians of Canada and eligible for full licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Newfoundland and Labrador.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply, however Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada will be given priority.
