A full-time faculty position in Primary Healthcare Research is available in St. John's. This position offers an academic salary that enables the candidate to balance the expected scholarly activities in education, leadership, and research with their existing personal academic or clinical commitments related to Primary Healthcare. This position is eligible for promotion and tenure in accordance with the Faculty of Medicine guidelines related to strong performance in education, leadership, research, and clinical or academic excellence. This position is anticipated to commence TBD, subject to approval.

Academic responsibilities include research leadership and scholarly contribution in the area of Primary Healthcare within the Discipline of Family Medicine and the Faculty of Medicine. Priorities for this position include advancing research in aging and elder care, chronic disease, health equity, lifestyle-related health, complex patient care, and health services. Faculty development in research methods (qualitative and/or quantitative), support for resident and faculty scholarly activity, and curriculum development in research training are key components of this role.

Candidates must hold a PhD or equivalent terminal degree in a field relevant to Primary Healthcare research. Candidates with an MD and additional graduate-level research training (e.g., MSc) will also be considered, provided they have a strong academic research background; however, this full-time academic position does not include funding for clinical work. Candidates must demonstrate a track record of primary healthcare research and be eligible for or have experience working with Canadian health research funding agencies. Experience in health economics or health policy research will be considered a strong asset.
