We are currently implementing Point of Care Testing (POCT) within CorCare. As part of this process, all POCT device-specific standard operating procedures are being updated to align with CorCare. Additionally, tip sheets, quick reference guides, and an overall operating procedure have been developed to support a smooth and efficient transition.
